### **Overall response to the evaluation**

Evaluation was carried out in orderly manner. Field visits were undertaken and various stakeholders were consulted. Due to security concerns, certain areas of project intervention could not be visited by the evaluation team. Conclusions drawn are generally valid. One training of 20 field staff were trained in epidemiological of investigation of infectious diseases which also included PPR. However, this was not a specific activity of the project as such. Both recommendations are being followed.
