INTRODUCTION

Only with knowledge can we free the world from hunger, malnutrition and poverty. According to the Basic Texts of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the Organization's first function is to "collect, analyse, interpret and disseminate information relating to nutrition, food and agriculture".

FAO plays a unique role as a neutral forum, providing unbiased, high-quality information across all areas relating to food, agriculture and sustainable natural resources management. Its more than 700 publications a year range from authoritative analysis for policy-makers and expert guidance for farmers to nutritional advice for families and general knowledge for young people.

In addition to English, most major reports are also produced in Arabic, Chinese, French, Russian and Spanish, and many publications are produced in other languages, ranging from Somali to Tagalog.

This catalogue includes the Organization's most recent titles, as well as older publications that have become references in their respective fields. The In Focus section presents priority areas, complementing the thematic section which covers long-standing areas of work. 

BUILDING RESILIENCE FOR PEACE AND FOOD SECURITY

Using both the traditional measure of the prevalence of undernourishment and a new indicator, the prevalence of severe food insecurity, this report marks a new era in the monitoring of food security and nutrition in the context of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and the UN Decade of Action on

Nutrition. The report warns that the long-term declining trend in undernourishment seems to have come to a halt and may have reversed. Meanwhile, though progress continues to be made in reducing child malnutrition, rising overweight and obesity are a concern in most parts of the world.





Global trade in food and agricultural products has grown almost threefold in value terms over the past decade. The challenge is to ensure that its expansion works for, and not against, the elimination of hunger, food insecurity and malnutrition. This edition of The State of





It showcases a unique collection of images documenting how FAO has long been there – in the fields, in the mountains, on the oceans, in the heat and dust, in the cold and wet – helping people to survive, progress and prosper.

Since 1945, FAO, the UN's first agency, has played a leading role in combating hunger worldwide. FAO's photo archives contain more than a million images covering its seven decades of commitment. This book contains just

a representative sample of shots to give readers an authentic picture of the Organization's activities from its pioneering early years through to today, with older images in black and white later giving way to colour. The photographs reflect FAO's various fields of activity (agriculture, fisheries, forestry, nutrition, etc.), and span the globe.

Some photographs have served as historical records, documenting situations and FAO's projects. Others have been used for didactic purposes, also as part of films and slideshows,

to explain innovative techniques and how to carry out practical operations in the field. A good picture can indeed paint more than a thousand words, especially in areas with high levels of illiteracy or where material is not available in local languages.

In addition to the photographs and their captions, text describes FAO's work and significant moments in its history through the decades. Some photographers also share their experiences and insights. Thus, readers can see the captured detail in the context of an evolving whole.







THE STORY OF THE FAO LIBRARY

65TH ANNIVERSARY 1952–2017 The book retraces the founding and development of the David Lubin Memorial Library, one of the richest collections of titles on food, agriculture and international development. It includes archival images, ranging from incunabula to rare hand-drawn illustrations.

In 1952 the FAO Library was officially opened in Rome and named the David Lubin Memorial Library in recognition of David Lubin who ideated the foundation of the International Institute of Agriculture (IIA), the

first permanent international organization in the field of agriculture. When FAO was founded in 1945, it

became the custodian of the IIA, inheriting a collection of half a million volumes from its library, one of the most important agricultural collections in the world. On top of this inheritance, the FAO Library began accumulating its own collection, preserving each and every FAO document ever published, reaching an impressive one million volumes today.

At the beginning of the 21st century, the FAO Library was entirely renovated and fully immersed in the digital age, exploring and implementing new technologies and computerizing services. The Library has also made huge efforts and progress in digitizing FAO publications, making them accessible from any location in the world. The goal is to have all FAO publications available in a digital format in the document repository of FAO.



In October 2015, Pope Francis' encyclical letter, Laudato si', was presented at FAO headquarters in Rome. The letter formed part of a series entitled FAO Dialogues, in which current global issues relevant to the Organization's work were discussed by specialists and representatives of governments and civil society.

Violations of human rights in the fishing sector are frequent, ongoing and require an urgent solution. Illegal fishing, exploitation of workers and human trafficking are all causes of grave concern for FAO. During the World Fisheries Day 2016, the two institutions jointly denounced and called for the eradication of these injustices. This book is a collection of speeches given on that occasion. The International Labour Organization (ILO) estimates that every year an average

of 24 000 fishermen and women lose their lives while at work. Human rights violations include labour abuse, forced labour, trafficking, child labour and slavery. According to this report, about USD267 billion per year are needed to achieve zero hunger. The publication examines the investment costs required to eliminate chronic dietary energy deficits by 2030. 

increased by approximately 20 percent worldwide over this period, reaching 7.4 million, although minor crops and crop wild relatives remained under-represented. With the development of new molecular techniques, the amount of data available on genetic diversity increased dramatically, leading to better understanding of areas such as domestication, genetic erosion and genetic vulnerability.







HOW ARE THE WORLD'S FORESTS CHANGING?

Some 129 million hectares of forest – an area almost equivalent in size to South Africa – have been lost since 1990, as populations increase and forest land is converted to agriculture and other uses. However, building on comprehensive data covering 234 countries and territories, this report shows that over the past 25 years the rate of net global deforestation has slowed by more than 50 percent. The publication also notes that an increasing amount of forest areas

have come under protection while more countries are improving forest management, although positive trends need to be strengthened further. The Global Forest Resources Assessment was first published in 1948, and provides five-yearly updates on the status of the world's forests.


