








The Africa Great Green Wall (GGW)

- African Union Commission endorsement (AUC) in 2007
- Drylands' development issues
- Resilience of human & natural systems
- Long-term solutions to desertification, land degradation, drought, climate change & biodiversity loss

 A people-centred approach to land management that seeks to capitalize on the dynamic linkages in the landscape between human and natural systems – Mosaic of Sustainable Land Management














ACP, EU and FAO expand the Great Green Wall for the Sahara and the Sahel Initiative

Contribute to (i) Poverty alleviation; (ii) ending hunger; (iii) improving resilience to Climate change using Landscape approach
















Specific Objective


3 main components

- Inter/Cross sectoral approaches at landscape level








