

Globally we are confronted with enormous tasks:



Most of these challenges cannot be solved by a single country. So "more of the same" at national level is not an option.



Example Germany: Insufficient relation between efforts and real progress

Investment efforts in the past:

- approx. 5.300 agricultural scientists at universities, Federal Research Institutes, universities of Applied Sciences etc.
- sufficient amount of research funding budgets

Output:

- certainly progress in several parts of agricultural & food sector
- huge number of Ph.D.s, publications, but research too often focused on specific subquestions and fractional economic, technological and physiological optimization

At the same time important questions are furthermore unsolved:

Loss of biodiversity, soil degradation, rural depopulation, expanding monocropping, harvest stagnation in organic farming, high level of food losses and food waste, decline of cultivated plant species and varieties, etc.



Conclusions and lessons learnt (not only in Germany):

- 1. Specifying the right priorities does not automatically lead to solutions for most pressing challenges.
- 2. High investments in agricultural research create growth of academic knowledge but do not automatically result in real societal progress.



Scientific "bits and pieces" usually do not add up to coherent, sustainable solutions!

Transnational problems cannot be tackled by national efforts!



In the light of this situation: Foundation of MACS-G20

- **→** MACS-G20 = Meeting of Agricultural Chief Scientists of G20 States
- established in 2011 by G20 Agricultural Ministers as a sciencepolicy interface
- → annual MACS-G20 meetings hosted by particular G20 presidency
- → Tasks: creating transparency of national agricultural research systems and funding structures in G20 states
 - bringing together national resources and cababilities
 - launch joint initiatives and formats to work on problems of global relevance




MACS Collaboration Initiative on Food Losses & Waste

- Collaboration Initiative on Food Losses and Waste was raised at the MACS meeting in Izmir (Turkey) in 2015
- aim of the Initiative is to concentrate the research and political consulting capacities of members in order to mobilize a <u>noticeable</u> reduction of food losses and waste on a global scale
- Germany introduced Felicitas Schneider as coordinator for activities derived from the MACS Initiative for four years



MACS Collaboration Initiative on Food Losses & Waste: Structure of activities





EIP-AGRI focus group "Reducing food loss on the farm"

- started in June 2018, lasts for one year
- focus on plant products (e.g. cereals, olives, fruit, vegetables)
- tasks, e.g.:
 - identify main factors causing loss of plant products
 - identify existing on-farm practices that limit losses
 - identify technologies and marketing to create value for non-sellable products
 - define strategies to reduce loss of plant products
 - explore options offered by digital technologies
- Felicitas was selected as expert for EIP AGRI focus group



International Food Awareness Day

- Argentina raised proposal to encourage FAO to establish an "International FLW Prevention Day"
- could be a very positive way to celebrate value of food
- September 29th is suggested
 - date of First Regional Dialogue on Food Loss and Waste in Latin America and the Caribbean
 - day is available in the UN calendar
 - near to World Food Day



Series of FLW related regional workshops

Our general idea: to expand FLW efforts beyond G20 borders

 Our tool: Thünen Institute organizes workshops together with G20 hosts in their respective country – target group: stakeholder in surrounded countries

• Our objective: G20 States shouldn't improve only their own agricultural and food systems; in fact they are responsible for impact everywhere by involving stakeholders from Non-G20 States!

Series of FLW related regional workshops

first workshop in June 2017 in Berlin, Germany:

 Participants: 41 national experts and coordinators from FLW related international platforms, projects and foundations from 17 countries (among them 13 G20-States), FAO, OECD and EU-Commission









- Focus on stocktaking and sharing international experiences around FLW challenges and policies
- developing road map for further collaborative activities on voluntary basis
