#### **Establishment**

21 February 1967

#### **Member countries**

Bahrain, Djibouti, Egypt, Eritrea, Ethiopia, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanese, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Sudan, Syrian, Emirates and Yemen.

### **Role of the Commission**



- strengthen the cooperation and coordination between member states;
- encourage joint activities at the national, regional and international levels on desert locust survey and control operations;
- encourage member states to implement the preventive control strategy against the desert locust;
- introduce modern technology in desert locust management, survey and control;
- provide financial and technical support to member states affected by desert locust outbreak.

#### **Commission activities**



Since its establishment 50 years ago, the Commission has implemented numerous activities to strengthen member countries in their battle against the desert locust:

- sessions, executive, and ad-hoc meetings to coordinate activities and review the locust situation;
- enhanced regional interaction and cooperation between the affected countries;
- contribution to the development of improved early detection and early warning systems;
- promotion of bilateral and multilateral assistance and donations;
- capacity-building through national and international training courses, regional and interregional workshops, and scholarships;
- development of Master Trainers training programme and material, including standard operating procedures and field guides;
- organization of joint cross-border surveys;
- support for the introduction of economic and environmentally safer control technologies, including evaluations of sprayers used in Desert Locust control;
- $\bullet$  development of contingency planning tools and rapid deployment plans.
