- Forest legality is an important issue in North America.
- The retail value of illegal logging, worldwide, is from \$52 billion to \$157 billion USD.
- Three well-attended information exchange webinars were convened.

The webinars and subsequent engagement between the Forest Service and CONAFOR have elevated the issue of illegal logging and supported existing forest legality cooperation between Mexico and the United States





Following webinar 3 on inter-agency collaboration, Canada held their own inter-agency meeting on illegal logging




Mexico potentially will **highlight the NAFC illegal logging work** at APEC

## **BoA** recommendation

- The Bureau of Alternates recommends the adoption of an ad hoc working group on illegal logging.
- It is an opportunity for NAFC to help raise awareness regarding this issue and strengthen coordination within and between countries.
- The webinars have already generated increased inter-agency collaboration; an ad hoc working group can build on this momentum.
- The BoA will gladly work on next steps, if approved.
