However, of the eight remaining council forests, six have been the subject of carbon inventories and four of biodiversity inventories. Additional resources were needed to finalize the revision of the management plans of these eight council forests.			
Recommendation 4. In future projects, FAO should develop clear internal project guidelines which clarify the roles, scope and limits of different actors intervening in the project. These guidelines need to be agreed from inception and will clarify information flows between actors and the mechanisms for addressing disagreements and conflicts.
