管理机构秘书的遴选和任命

内容提要

引言

1. 根据《条约》第 20.1 条，条约秘书由总干事任命并经管理机构批准。
2. 在 2016 年 12 月的第一五五届会议上，粮农组织理事会审议了第 XIV 条各机构秘书的任命问题，并“注意到根据大会决定及按粮农组织《章程》第 XIV 条所设机构的设立条约规定，秘书由总干事任命，经相关机构批准”。理事会确认有必要在按第 XIV 条所设机构的职能自主权与粮农组织对于此类机构负有责任之间实现平衡。理事会强调了填补《条约》秘书空缺职位的紧迫性，并作为例外，商定了一个根据粮农组织高级职员任命标准程序确定的《条约》秘书遴选流程，并请《条约》成员的两位代表参加面试小组。
3. 按照理事会确定的程序发布了《条约》秘书职位空缺通告，为期 45 日，从 2016 年 12 月 12 日至 2017 年 1 月 26 日。之后收到了有关申请，并根据空缺通告的要求和能力进行了审核。随后成立了一个面试小组，包括以下成员：气候、生物多样性、土地及水利部助理总干事 René Castro-Salazar 先生，农业及消费者保护部助理总干事王韧先生，以及人力资源司特别顾问 Basharat Ali 先生。根据理事会的决定，条约管理机构主席 Muhamad Sabran 先生和条约主席团成员 Svanhild-Isabelle Batta Torheim 女士，作为条约缔约方代表参加了面试小组。面试小组共对 12 位候选人进行了面试，随后向总干事提交了一份报告，提出了一张该职位可考虑录用的候选人短名单。
