INFORMATION NOTE FOR PARTICIPANTS

DATE AND PLACE

At the kind invitation of the US Forest Service, the 30th Session of the North American Forest Commission (NAFC) will be held in Missoula, Montana at the University Center of the University of Montana followed by field visits.

Missoula is a city in the U.S. state of Montana and is the county seat of Missoula County. It is located along the Clark Fork River near its confluences with the Bitterroot and Blackfoot Rivers in western Montana and at the convergence of five mountain ranges, thus it is often described as the "hub of five valleys". In 2018, the United States Census Bureau estimated the population of the Missoula Metropolitan Area at 118,791.

Kalispell is a city in, and the county seat of Flathead County, Montana, United States. The 2015 Census estimates put Kalispell's population at 22,052. The name Kalispell is a Salish word meaning "flat land above the lake". Kalispell is also the gateway to Glacier National Park.

WORKING LANGUAGE

The working language for this session of the Commission shall be English, however 2. documentation is provided in English and Spanish. Simultaneous interpretation Spanish - English and English - Spanish will be provided by the host country, as needed.

WEATHER

16. The daily temperatures in Missoula, Montana, range from an average high of 79°F (26°C) to a low of 40°F (4°C). The chance of rain in Missoula is about 20 percent in early September. In Kalispell, the temperatures are slightly cooler with more chances of rain.

ELECTRICITY

17. Electricity in the United States is 110-120V.
