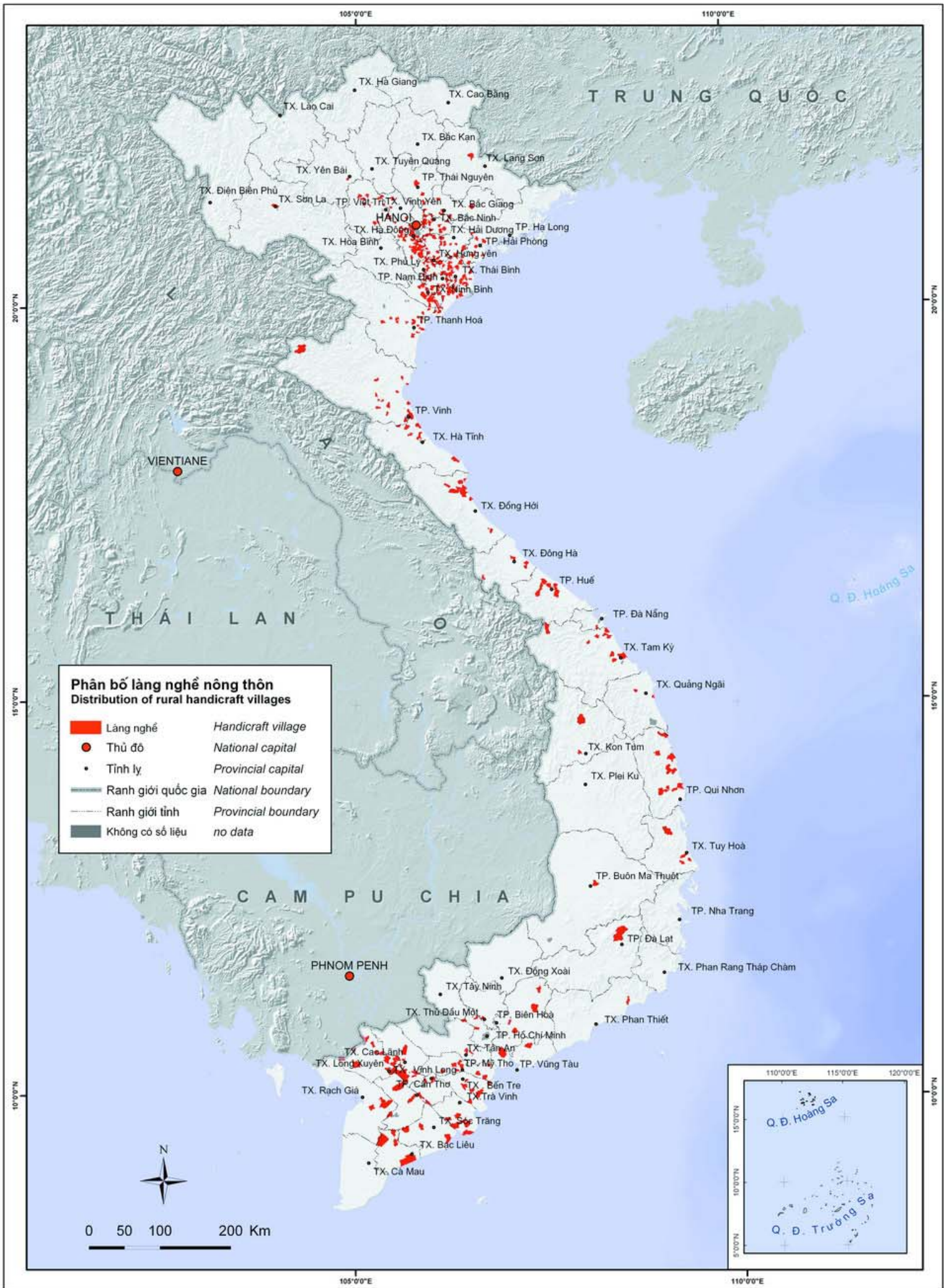


Agricultural Atlas of Viet Nam A Depiction of the 2001 Rural Agriculture and Fisheries Census

Commercial Farms and Cooperatives – Handicraft

Distribution of Rural Handicraft Villages

For the purposes of the 2001 census a handicraft village was defined as one having 50% of its labourers working at the same craft or home industry - with their products produced mainly for sale and the income generated accounting for at least 50% of the village's total income. These are typically traditional crafts that have been passed from generation to generation and a handicraft village may comprise one or several hamlets working at the same craft. According to the census there were 710 handicraft villages in Vietnam in 2001, involving 187,700 households and 495,700 labourers. Among these, 264 were traditional handicraft villages and 446 were newly established. The map shows the Red River Delta to be the region with the most handicraft villages (273). Other regions with significant numbers include the North Central Coast, with 87; the Mekong River Delta, with 116; and South Central Coast, with 46.
