# LOCUST SITUATION IN INDIA:- (01st December, 2009 to 31th May 2010)

Scheduled distant and cross country Desert Locust surveys in the Scheduled Desert Area of India and adjacent Indo- Pak border were conducted by the officers and staff of Locust Warning Organization which revealed that India continued to remain free from solitary/ gregarious Desert Locust activity.

## WEATHER

Rainfall: Light to Moderate rainfall has been reported at Churu and Suratgarh of the scheduled desert area of India in the range of 1.4 mm to 4.4 mm.

Wind direction: Wind direction at 300 m remained SW to NE during the month of May, 2010.

# LOCUST SITUATION IN PAKISTAN (01st December, 2009 to 31st May, 2010)

Pakistan remained free from gregarious locust activity. However, some mature solitary adults ranging from 1-25/hectare were observed in eight localities of Uthal, Turbat and Pasni areas in winter-spring breeding zone of Balochistan during the reporting period. A maximum population of 25 adults / hectare was observed at Jerai (253548N-664256E) in Uthal area on 23-04-2010.

#### WEATHER

Cold and dry weather prevailed in the entire locust breeding areas from December, 2009 to the end of January, 2010. After that the weather started to become hot and dry in the winter as well as summer breeding areas. Light to heavy rainfall occurred in Sindh, Punjab and Balochistan. Detail is as under: -

#### **FORECAST:**

Due to hot temperature and low/trace rainfall on both sides, the vegetation is dry. Soil moisture is very deep. The prevailing conditions are therefore not suitable for further increase in the locust population. Since onset of monsoon and Phet cyclone rain locust population may increase.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS:**

Fortnightly Desert Locust Bulletins for the reporting period of both countries were exchanged and discussed. A discussion on Tropical Cyclone "Phet" and its effect on locust activity was also made and decided to keep close vigilance if heavy rainfall occurs due to Cyclone. However keeping in view of Tropical cyclone "Phet" and early Monsoon, normal

vigilance on locust activity in the Scheduled Desert Areas of both countries are continued and strict vigilance may require from July, 2010.
