LOCUST SITUATION IN INDIA

Scheduled distant, cross country and special border Desert Locust surveys in the Scheduled Desert Area of India and adjacent Indo- Pak border were conducted by the officers and staffs of Locust Warning Organization which revealed that India continued to remain free from gregarious Desert Locust activity. However Solitarious Immature and mature adults were reported at few places as given below. Soil moisture was suitable for Locust breeding in scheduled desert area.

LOCUST SITUATION IN PAKISTAN (1st July, 2009 to 15th August, 2009)

Pakistan remained free from gregarious locust activity during the period under report. However, scattered mature / immature solitary adults ranging from 01-100/ ha. were observed in 37 localities of Bahawalpur, Rahimyar Khan, Sukkur and Mirpur Khas reas of Punjab and Sindh. A maximum population of 100 adults / hectare was observed at Kirwaro (264218N-684337E) on 29-07-2009 near Sukkur, Sindh.
