# LOCUST SITUATION IN PAKISTAN (08 June, 2008 to 0<sup>-th</sup> July, 2008)

Pakistan remained free from gregarious locust activity during the period under report. However, mature solitary adults locust population ranging from 1-50 / ha, were observed in 1º localities of Bahawalpur areas. A maximum population of 50 adults / ha, was observed at Bijnot Area(280522N-713826E) in Bahawalpur on 07-06-2008 during the reporting period. Solitary hoppers of 3<sup>rd</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> instar were reported in an area of 100 hectare at Post 6-R (282550N-721236E) and 50 hectares at Post 8-R (282551N-721236E) of Bahawalpur on 22-06-2008.

#### RAINFALL:

Hot and dry weather prevailed over the entire region during the reporting period. However, moderate rainfall occurred at some places of locust breeding areas.

# LOCUST SITUATION IN INDIA 10 June, 2008 to 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2008

Scheduled distant, cross country and border desret locust surveys in the Scheduled Desert Area of India and adjacent Indo-Pak border were conducted by the officers and staff of Locust Warning Organisation which revealed that India continued to remain free from any solitarious/ gregarious desert locust activity. Soil moisture is not suitable for locust breeding along Indo-Pak border.

#### WEATHER

a). Rainfall: Light to moderate rainfall has been reported from some parts of the scheduled desert area of India in the range of 0.2 mm 60.4 mm. District wise rainfall data are given below: -

b). Wind Direction: Wind direction at 300 m remained SW to NE during the month.

## **FORECAST:**

No rainfall occurred during the reporting period in the area, scattered solitary locust population may increase on set of monsoon. Infiltration from spring breeding area is likely to take place in rainfed area of summer / monsoon breeding areas. Hence strict vigilance on locust development in the Scheduled Desert Areas of both the countries is required to be maintained.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

1. Fortnightly desert locust situation bulletins were exchanged between the two delegates.
