PROCEEDING OF THE FOURTH BORDER MEETING BETWEEN THE LOCUST OFFICERS OF PAKISTAN AND INDIA HELD AT KHOKHROPAR-MUNABAO BORDER POINT 0930 HOURS (PST) / 0900 HOURS (IST) ON FIRST OF SEPTEMBER, 2008

LOCUST SITUATION IN PAKISTAN

(1st August 2008 to 31st August, 2008)

Pakistan remained free from gregarious locust activity during the period under discussion. However, scattered, mature and immature solitary adult population ranging from 06-250 adults / hectare was observed in 38 localities of Cholistan desert in Bahawalpur region. A maximum population of 250 adults/hectare was observed at sixth Wala Soori Post (27 52 58 N - 71 39 20 E) on 09th August 2008.

Strict watch is being maintained over the entire summer and overlap breeding area by regular fortnightly surveys.

RAINFALL

Hot and dry weather prevailed over the entire region during the reporting period. However, medium to heavy rain fell in the desert areas during the fortnight. The Cholistan desert stations: Bahawalpur received 106 mm, Rahimyar Khan 71 mm, and Tharparkar desert stations: Chhachhro 60 mm, Nagarparkar 37 mm, Diplo 20 mm, and Mithy 13 mm.

LOCUST SITUATION IN INDIA (01st August, 2008 to 31st August, 2008)

Scheduled distant, cross country and border Desert Locust surveys in the Scheduled Desert Area of India and adjacent Indo-Pak border were conduct by the officers and staff of Locust Warning Organization which revealed that India continued to remain free from gregarious Desert Locust activity. Soil moisture was suitable for locust breeding in scheduled desert area.

WEATHER

(a) Rainfall: Light to Moderate rainfall has been reported from some parts of the scheduled desert area of India in the range of 0.5 to 150 mm. District wise rainfall data is given below:-

(b) Wind direction: Wind direction at 300 m remained SW to NE during the month.

FORECAST:

Scattered solitary locust population may further increase in summer breeding areas and may concentrate in the area where recent rainfall occurred. Hence, strict vigilance on locust activity in the schedule Desert Areas of both countries should be maintained.
