Proceedings of the Third Indo-Pak border meeting held on 9th August,, 2005 at Munabao / Khokhropar Border meeting point

Locust situation in India (1st July,2005 to 31st July,2005): Scheduled short, distant and border locust surveys in scheduled desert area of India and adjacent Indo-Pak border were conducted by the officers and staff of Locust Warning Organisation (LWO) which revealed that India continued to remain free from any gregarious locust activity. However, scattered solitary mature / maturing adults were reported from ten localities of Jodhpur district at the density ranging from 50 to 2500 PSKM (maximum being at Radah (260749N-720446E) and 375 PSKM at Asutar (2711N-7014E) of district Jaisalmer of Rajasthan. Soil moisture was not suitable for locust breeding in border districts of Bikaner, Barmer, Jaisalmer and Palanpur.

Weather:

a) Rainfall: Light to heavy rainfall has been reported from some parts of the scheduled desert areas of India in the range of 0.6 to 93.0 mm. District-wise number of localities and rainfall data are given below:

b) Wind direction: Wind direction at 300 m remained South West to North East during the month

Locust Situation in Pakistan (1st July, 2005 to 31st July, 2005): Pakistan continued to remain free from gregarious locust activity during the period under report. However scattered mature solitary adults ranging from 2-100/ha were observed in 62 localities of Lasbela, Tharparkar, Nara and Cholistan desert of summer / monsoon breeding areas. A maximum population of 100 adults / ha was observed at Jaruhi (2644N-6909E) in Nara desert of Sukkur on 7th July, 2005.

Weather: Light to moderate rainfall occurred at some places of locust breeding areas and heavy rains on 29th and 30th July, 2005 in the areas of Nagarparkar in Thar and Rahimyar khan in Cholistan desert.

Forecast: Since ecological conditions are conducive for locust breeding in summer breeding areas, therefore, patchy breeding and population of adults may increase in both the countries. Hence strict vigilance is required in the scheduled desert area of India and Pakistan.

Miscellaneous:

- 1 Fortnightly Desert Locust Situation Bulletins from June, 05 to July, 05 of both the countries were exchanged.
- Both the delegates agreed to establish wireless communication at 13.30 hours (IST) / 13.00 (PST) on the allotted frequency from 16th August, 2005.
- Both the delegates agreed to conduct the 1st special locust border survey under FAO Assistance programme along the border in both countries w.e.f 22.08.2005 to 29.08.2005. The findings of the survey will be discussed in the next meeting.

<u>Venue of the next meeting</u>: The 4th border meeting of the year 2005 would be held at Khokhropar / Munabao on 7th September, 05 at 0800 hours (PST/ 0830 hours (IST).
