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Promoting strategies for prevention and control of HPAI that focus on smallholder livelihoods and biodiversity

What are the expectations of the donor?



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Where the discussion started:

- In most of the affected countries smallholder production systems play an important role. The birds kept in these systems represent an important contribution to household food security, income, social capital, and to the poultry biodiversity of the country.
- Women play a significant role in poultry keeping and as a result, poultry contribute directly to household food security and the wellbeing of children.
- Current veterinary strategies and policies have not been designed with these stakeholders in mind.



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How the project was designed

Considering the starting point of the discussions, FAO was identified as the most qualified agency to achieve the project, as it requires expertise from four departments of FAO in animal health, animal production, economics, livelihoods, gender, trade, and biodiversity.

This expertise was already used to design the project.



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The workshop

- The Logframe of the Project Document was developed in a workshop with participation of AGAH, AGAL, AGAP, TCEO and others.
- The workshop was moderated by GTZ.

- The project will contribute to creating a safe production environment for smallholders, which supports sustainable livelihoods and bio-diversity

Immediate Objectives

- National HPAI preventive and control policies have adopted smallholder and bio-diversity sensitive strategies in three countries.
- Developed strategies are considered on regional and global levels.



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Expected Outputs

- Effective strategies developed to control and prevent HPAI that are smallholder and bio-diversity friendly
- Lessons learnt at country level fed into regional and global planning
- National technical and institutional requirements identified to implement the strategic plans
- Capacity building within key national counterparts
- Project findings are fully reflected in the work of ECTAD
