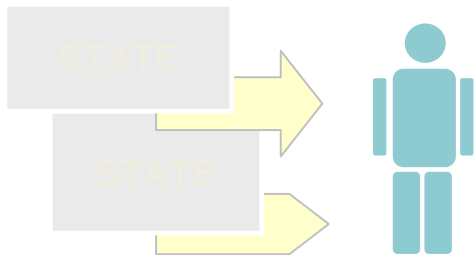
Human Rights-Based Approach to Culling

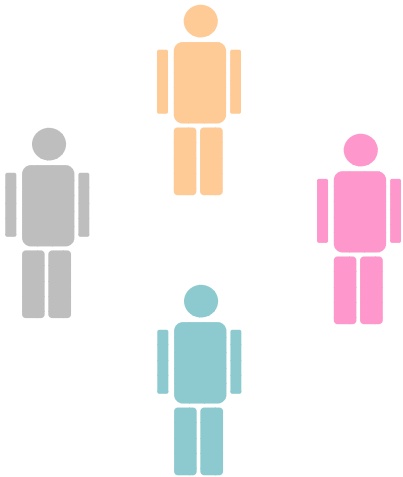
Human Rights-Based Approach to Culling

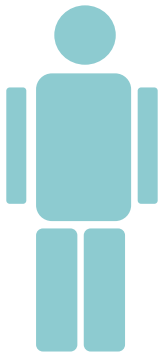

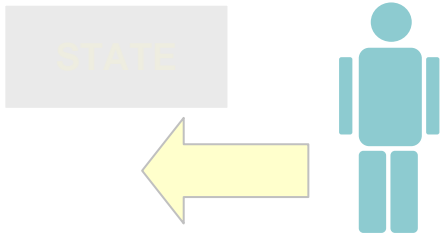

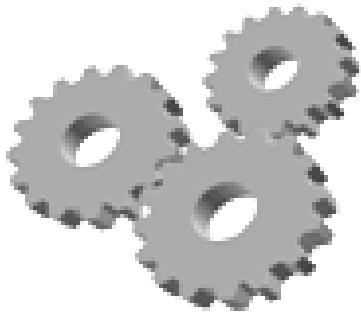
