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THE 24TH SESSION OVERVIEW

The 24th Session of the Codex Committee on Residues of Veterinary Drugs in Foods (CCRVDF) will take place from April 22-27, 2018 in Chicago, Illinois at InterContinental Chicago Magnificent Mile.

The plenary session will open on Monday, April 23 at 09:30 and conclude after the report adoption on Friday, April 27. On Sunday, April 22 the Physical Working Group on the Priority List of Veterinary Drugs

requiring Evaluation or Re-evaluation by JECFA will take place from 09:00 – 12:00. In addition, on-site registration (to collect your badges and other materials) will take place from 08:00 – 18:00.

Any reservations requested after this date will be based on availability and subject to the standard hotel room rate at the time. The group rate may not be honored after the cutoff date.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If you do not book through this link by Friday, March 23rd, 2018, we cannot guarantee that your reservation will include complimentary wifi, breakfast or any other CCRVDF concessions that are available under the negotiated CCRVDF group rate.

You will need to provide a credit card upon booking your room. If your plans change, you may cancel without penalty 72 hours prior to your arrival. We encourage all delegates to secure a reservation as early as possible. Your credit card will not be charged until you check-in at the hotel.

The CCRVDF special room rates per night are: \$252.41 (for single and double occupancy), \$287.63 (for Triple occupancy) and \$322.85 (for quadruple occupancy) inclusive of the 17.4% sales tax. It includes complimentary breakfast buffet, wireless guestroom Internet (wifi), and daily passes to the fitness center. Please note the special rate is available only until March 23rd, 2018, on a room available basis; please make your reservations early.

The CCRVDF group rate is available 3 days pre and 3 days post based on hotel availability if you plan to extend your stay.

VISA REQUIREMENTS



Those who will require a visa to enter the United States are strongly encouraged to begin the visa application process as soon as possible. Most delegates will be considered “independent travelers” and will need to apply for a B1/B2 visa. Additional information may be found at the following site:

travel.state.gov/content/visas/en/visit/visitor.html

According to the U.S. State Department, all government officials will need a **diplomatic note** to accompany the visa application. In addition, many U.S. Embassies require in-person interviews that may take time to schedule and openings may not be available at the last moment. Please consult the nearest U.S. Embassy for additional guidance.

Although the U.S. Codex Office cannot influence the visa process, we will assist in any way we can, including providing notification of registration letters to each registered delegate. It is the responsibility of delegates to begin the visa application process in a timely manner, and if this is not done well in advance, it may not be possible to obtain a visa in time to attend the meeting.

We believe it is important that delegates from all Member Countries and Organizations have the opportunity to participate in Codex meetings. Completing and submitting the visa application promptly will ensure that the work of Codex accurately reflects the views and contributions of all its Members.

GETTING TO/AROUND CHICAGO



FLYING IN

Chicago is supported by two airports; O'Hare International Airport (ORD) and Chicago Midway International Airport (MDW).

For international flights, we suggest booking your flight into O'Hare International Airport (ORD); 20 miles (32 kilometers) from the airport to the Intercontinental Hotel. ORD is the fourth busiest airport in the world with connections to 60 international cities and third in the United States with an average of 2,400 aircraft operations per day. It is also the largest United States hub for American Airlines and United Airlines.

For domestic flights, we suggest Chicago Midway International Airport (MDW); 13 miles (21 kilometers) from the airport to the hotel. MDW is the second largest airport in Chicago with over 60 non-stop destinations, and a major hub for Southwest Airlines.

TRANSPORTATION TO THE INTERCONTINENTAL HOTEL

TAXIS and RIDE SHARES (Uber/Lyft)

Taxis and Ride Share Services are the most convenient mode of transportation to and from the airport. Typically, ride share services such as Uber and Lyft are less expensive than taxis. Uber and Lyft riders may request a private car or economical shared car which will pick other passengers up along the way and discount your ride cost. To use Uber or Lyft, you must download the respective mobile app.

FROM ORD, it's about 30-50 minutes depending on traffic.

- It is best to wait to request the pickup only when you're ready to walk outside.
- LYFT riders at the Domestic Terminal and UBER riders requesting UberX, UberXL, and UberSELECT should meet their driver upstairs on the Departures level in the Rideshare Pickup zone.
- LYFT and UBER riders at the International Terminal (5) or requesting UberBLACK should meet their driver downstairs on the Arrivals level.
- Confirm your location. Enter your terminal and door number or pickup zone and navigate to the Rideshare Pickup zone so your driver knows where to find you.

FROM MDW, it's about 25-45 minutes depending on traffic.

- It is best to wait to request the pickup only when you're ready to walk outside.
- UBER riders requesting at MDW should meet their driver downstairs on the arrivals level (near baggage claim). Exit through door 4, cross the street, and meet your driver in the center lane.
- LYFT riders requesting at MDW will be directed to Departures, Door 1.
- Confirm your location. Enter your terminal and door number or pick-up zone so your driver knows where to find you.

'L' TRAIN PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

From ORD, take the Blue Line 'L' Train which runs 24-hours and is located on the Lower level of Terminal 2. Take the train towards Forest Park and get off at Washington (17 stops). From there either:

- Walk .7 miles (about 15 minutes) to the hotel.
- Transfer to the Red Line - walk 1 block to the Lake Red Line Station at N State St. and E. Benton Pl. Take the train towards Howard and get off at Grand (3 stops). Head east on E. Grand Ave for .3 miles (5 minutes), the hotel is 3 blocks from the station at the corner of E. Grand Ave and N. Michigan Ave.
- Take a taxi the rest of the way to the hotel. Taxi fare is estimated at \$9.

Metro fare is \$5 from ORD and \$2.50 to ORD; train transfer is included in price.

From MDW, take the Orange Line 'L' Train which runs from 4:30 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. The fully-accessible station is located just east of the airport terminal building at the Midway Transportation Center and is connected to the airport via an enclosed walkway. Follow the signs in the airport that read "CTA Trains" or "Trains to City." An orange line painted on the ground will guide you to the station. Take the train towards "LOOP L" and either:

- Get off at Roosevelt (7 stops) and transfer to the Red Line. Take the Red Line train towards Howard and get off at Grand (5 stops). Head east on E. Grand Ave for .3 miles (5 minutes), the hotel is 3 blocks from the station at the corner of E. Grand Ave and N. Michigan Ave. This route is around 25-30 minutes.
- Get off at State & Lake (13 stops) and walk .5 miles (about 10 minutes) to the hotel or take a taxi the rest of the way. Taxi fare is estimated at \$7. This route is around 35-40 minutes.

Metro fare is \$2.50 (one way) to and from MDW, train transfer is included in price.

GO AIRPORT EXPRESS SHUTTLE

This is a shared-ride service that transports delegates to and from the hotel. It takes longer than a taxi due to more frequent stops but may be more affordable, especially if travelling alone. Private rides are also available. For specific fare quotes and reservations go to AIRPORT EXPRESS.

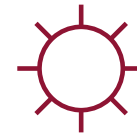

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION IN CHICAGO

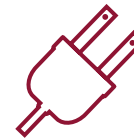


CONNECTING WITH CHICAGO



WEATHER

- April in Chicago may exhibit spring-like weather; however, winter may want to stick around, so the weather forecast is still a little unpredictable.
- The average high temperature in April may reach 15°C (about 59°F), but it may drop down as low as 4°C (about 39°F) at night.
- We would suggest that you pack a warm coat, gloves, and a hat in the event winter stays around longer than it should! It is also a good idea to layer your clothing so that you can remove or add garments as needed for comfort.



ELECTRICAL CURRENT

- Electrical appliances operate on 110 volts (60Hz).
- Power outlets accommodate two prong or three prong plugs.



CURRENCY

- United States Dollar (\$)
- ATM Machines and Currency Exchange are available at the airport upon arrival Chicago.
- Credit cards accepted—Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Discover, Diners, and JCB.
- You may use your bank or credit card as long as you have a 4 digit pin and/or a chip.

TIPS AND TAXES

- All prices are subject to a 10.25% sales tax in the city of Chicago.
- Please note that taxi fares and restaurant bills do not include gratuities. It is therefore customary to add a 15-20% tip when settling a bill.

LOCAL ATTRACTIONS

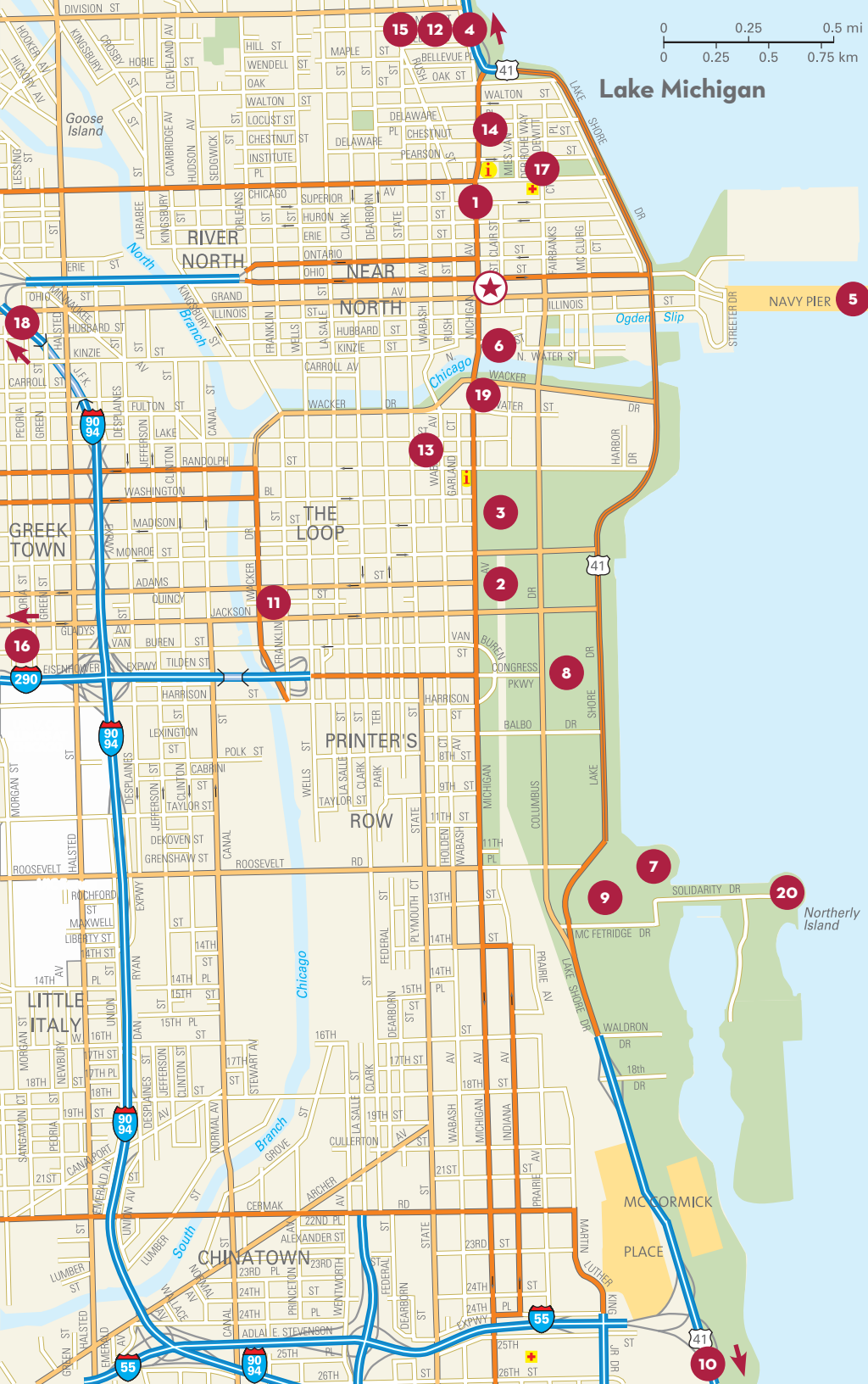
