

CRITICAL REVIEW OF THE DRAFT STANDARDS AND RELATED TEXTS SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSION FOR ADOPTION

- 1. In accordance with the Uniform Procedure for the Elaboration of Codex Standards and Related Texts, Part 2. Critical Review, paragraph 8, the texts submitted to the Commission for consideration for adoption should be examined:
 - for consistency with the mandate of Codex, the decisions of the Commission, and existing Codex texts.
 - to ensure that the requirements of the endorsement procedure have been fulfilled, where appropriate,
 - for format and presentation, and
 - for linguistic consistency.
- 2. The draft standards and related texts submitted to the Commission for adoption are listed in the Appendix to this document with notes to draw the attention of the Executive Committee and the Commission to specific issues, and the status of endorsement where relevant. Endorsement is mentioned only when applicable for the text under consideration. There are no comments in the Table when no specific problems exist as regards the criteria mentioned in the Critical Review and the texts proposed for adoption were finalized by consensus in the Committee concerned.
- 3. This document should be read in conjunction with ALINORM 05/28/5 List of Draft Standards and Related Texts Submitted to the Commission for Adoption and ALINORM 05/28/5A Comments submitted by Governments and interested international organizations.

ANNEX 1

PART I

Notes on the texts submitted for adoption by the Committee on Food Additives and Contaminants

ALINORM 06/29/12, Appendix VII

Draft and proposed draft food additive provisions of the General Standard for Food Additives (GSFA) Step 8 ALINORM 06/29/12, Appendix VII

Appendix VII contains food additive provisions of Codex Standards with a one-to-one relationship with the GSFA Food Category to be included in the GSFA (this is the first step of the ongoing work of CCFAC for moving the food additive provisions of the Codex commodity standards into the GSFA).

General issues

The additives provisions listed in Appendix VII are presented as being at Step 8, but they have different status. Several of these provisions are the transfer of additive levels in adopted standards, while others are considered as amendments to these provisions. Some others are proposal for revocation of additive levels in the GSFA in order to eliminate inconsistencies within the Codex Alimentarius.

The following recommendations are proposed for clarification purposes.

CCFAC should, in its future reports, clearly establish a distinction between:

- a) additive provisions included in adopted standards and proposed for incorporation into the GSFA. Their transfer to the GSFA do not require consideration of substantialce matters.
- b) revocation of existing provisions in the GSFA in order to endure consistency with existing standards
- c) proposed amendments to current additives provisions in Codex standards for inclusion in the GSFA. These amendments may be referred to the relevant Committee (when active committees exist and relevant standards are under consideration). The Committee may also develop them as new provisions or amendments to the GSFA, in which case they should follow the Step Procedure in order to allow for comments.

When provisions for additives for inclusion into the GSFA result in amendments to additive provisions in Codex standards, consequential amendments should be made to the relevant standards.

The reports of CCFAC should include a table showing the existing additive provisions in the Codex standards in order to facilitate their consideration.

Specific issues

Food Category No. 02.2.1.2 Margarine and Similar Products

Appendix VII refers to "GSFA food categories with a one-to-one relationship to a single commodity standard'. However, the Standard for Margarine applies to margarine only, not to similar products and the category does not correspond exactly to the standard. The Draft Standard for Fat Spreads and Blended Spreads is under consideration by the Committee on Fats and Oils, in particular as regards the additives section.

As mentioned above, several provisions are already adopted additive levels in the Standard for Margarine, while some are amendments to these provisions and others are proposals for revocation of current provisions of the GSFA in order to ensure consistency with the Standard for Margarine. For example, phosphates at a level of 40 mg are not included in the current Standard for Margarine.

It is proposed that consideration of all additives provisions for "margarine and similar products" be deferred until the Draft Standard for Fat Spreads and Blended Spreads has been finalized by the CCFO in 2007 and a list of additives submitted for endorsement to CCFAC. At the same time, CCFAC is invited to review the relevant section of the food category system in such a way to achieve complete one-to-one correspondence with the provisions in the two standards mentioned above.

Food Category No. 11.1.2 Powdered sugar, powdered dextrose

The additive provisions do not correspond exactly to the provision in the Standard for Sugars, that allows only Calcium phosphate, tribasic, at a level of 15000 mg/kg. The proposal in Appendix VII refers to Phosphates at a level of 6600 mg/kg. CCFAC should clarify whether this provision is at Step 8 as part of the GSFA.

Food Category No 12.1.1 Salt

In the current Standard for Food Grade Salt, ferric ammonium citrate is not listed and calcium ferrocyanide is at a different level (10 mg/kg instead of 14 mg/kg for all ferrocyanides)

Only tricalcium orthophosphate is allowed at a level of 20000mg/kg, while Appendix VII lists all phosphates at a level of 8800 mg/kg.

As regards polysorbates in salt, this is a new level for inclusion in the GSFA and it may be clarified whether it went through the Step Procedure as part of the GSFA. This will also require a consequential amendment to the Standard for Food Grade Salt, that currently lists only Polyxyethylene (20) sorbitan monooleate (433).

551 silicon dioxide (amorphous) (referred to as Step 7) is already included in the Standard for Food Grade Salt and can be transferred to the GSFA.

Food Category No 13.1.1 Infant Formulae

In Appendix VII, all provisions for thickeners, emulsifiers and antioxidants are different from the levels in the Standard for Infant Formula (generally ten times higher) and some conditions of use for various types of infant formula have been deleted.

The levels for acidity regulators correspond with the Standard but the conditions of use related to the section on nutritional requirements are missing.

The revision of the Standard for Infant Formula is currently under discussion in the Committee on Nutrition and Foods for Special Dietary Uses. CCFAC will have the possibility to consider the list of additives and make any amendments that may be necessary as part of the endorsement process.

It is proposed that the adoption of new levels for additives in infant formula be deferred until the CCNFSDU has completed the revision of the standard.

Food Category No 13.1.2 Follow-up Formulae

The list of additives in the Standard for Follow-up Formula is mostly the same as in the Standard for Infant Formula (only additions being two antioxidants and pectins). All additives in Appendix VII have been amended as in the Standard for Infant Formula, with levels ten times higher.

This standard is not under revision in the CCNFSDU. However, in view of the close relationship with the Standard for Infant Formula, it would be preferable to ask the advice of the CCNFSDU regarding proposed amendments to it is expected that when the additive list is finalized for infant formula, the CCNFSDU may initiate a revision of the Standard for Follow-up Formula.

It is proposed that the adoption of new levels for additives in follow-up formula be deferred until the CCNFSDU has completed the revision of the Standard for Infant Formula or that the matter be referred for consideration by the CCNFSDU.

ALINORM 06/29/12, Appendix IX Proposals to revise Commodity Standards with a One to One Relationship with a GSFA Food Category

This is a proposal to replace the section on additives in several individual standards with the following text in all standards corresponding to the food categories listed in Annex VII:

"Food Additives listed in tables 1 and 2 of the Codex General Standard for Food Additives in Food Category (reference of the category) may be used in foods subject to this standard"

As regards Margarine and Infant Formula, as mentioned concerning Appendix VII above, these standards are under revision, including the section on additives, and it is proposed to defer any amendment to the current section until the revised standard has been finalized.

This proposal also raises a general issue: the replacement of a section on additives listing specific additives in the standards with a general reference to the GSFA, which is not consistent with the current provisions of the Procedural Manual, whereby the name and levels of food additives should be specified in the standard. The relevant provisions appear in the **Format of Codex Commodity Standards** and the **Relations between Commodity Committees and General Committees**, as follows

Format of Codex Commodity Standards

Food Additives

This section should contain the names of the additives permitted and, where appropriate, the maximum amount permitted in the food. It should be prepared in accordance with guidance given in the section on Food Additives and Contaminants in the Relations between Commodity Committees and General Committees, and may take the following form:

"The following provisions in respect of food additives and their specifications as contained in section of the Codex Alimentarius are subject to endorsement [have been endorsed] by the Codex Committee on Food Additives and Contaminants."

Then should follow a tabulation, viz.:

"Name of additive, maximum level (in percentage or mg/kg)."

Relations between Commodity Committees and General Committees

Food Additives and Contaminants

Codex commodity committees should prepare a section on food additives in each draft commodity standard and this section should contain all the provisions in the standard relating to food additives. The section should include the names of those additives which are considered to be technologically necessary or which are widely permitted for use in the food within maximum levels where appropriate.

All provisions in respect of food additives (including processing aids) and contaminants contained in Codex commodity standards should be referred to the Codex Committee on Food Additives and Contaminants

(...)

When an active commodity committee exists, proposals for the use of additives in any commodity standard under consideration should be prepared by the committee concerned, and forwarded to the Codex Committee on Food Additives and Contaminants for endorsement. When the Codex Committee on Food Additives and Contaminants decides not to endorse specific additives provisions (use of the additive, or level in the end-product), the reason should be clearly stated. The section under consideration should be referred back to the Committee concerned if further information is needed, or for information if the Codex Committee on Food Additives and Contaminants decides to amend the provision.

When no active commodity committee exists, proposals for new additive provisions or amendment of existing provisions, should be forwarded directly by member countries to the Codex Committee on Food Additives and Contaminants.

On the other hand, it is recalled that the Commission, at its 28th Session, agreed to transfer the list of endorsed food additive provisions from the General Standard for Fruit Juices and Nectars to the General Standard for Food Additives and include the reference to the General Standards for Food Additives (GSFA) under the Section on Food Additives of the Standard, noting that there was full correspondence between the products covered by the Standard and the food category system of the GSFA. The Commission also noted that this approach was consistent with the development of the GSFA although this might not be the case for other commodities which might require the list of additive provisions be retained in the commodity standard until the GSFA was completed in the future. The Commission therefore agreed to request CCFAC to examine the matter of how the endorsed list of additive provisions of commodity standards could systematically be incorporated into the GSFA. (ALINORM 05/28/41 paras 62-63).

Accordingly, the CCFAC has initiated the revision of the relevant sections of the Procedural Manual on this matter (ALINORM 06/29/12, paras 68-69) and this is expected to result in several amendments to the Procedural Manual in the near future.

The Executive Committee is invited to consider the above information as part of the critical review.

PART II

Endorsement of Food Labelling Provisions in the Standards for Milk and Milk Products

Draft Standard for a Blend of Evaporated Skimmed Milk and Vegetable Fat

<u>Draft Standard for a Blend of Skimmed Milk and Vegetable Fat in Powdered Form</u>

Draft Standard for a Blend of Sweetened Condensed Skimmed Milk and Vegetable Fat

The Committee agreed to add the words "Subject to the legislation of the country of retail sale..." at the beginning of section 7.5, which refers to a advisory statement and endorsed the labelling provisions as amended. The Committee noted the concerns expressed by the Delegation of Canada, that it should be considered further whether the addition of the phrase in 7.5 could lead to consistency problems with other standards for milk and milk products (ALINORM 06/29/22, paras. 40-42). The section would then read as follows.

7.5 ADVISORY STATEMENT

Subject to the legislation of the country of retail sale, a statement shall appear on the label to indicate that the product should not be used as a substitute for infant formula. For example, "NOT SUITABLE FOR INFANTS".

<u>Secretariat Note (for information)</u>: The relevant standards were checked and no "advisory statement" appears in the Standard for Evaporated Milks (CODEX STAN A-3 1971, Rev.1-1999) or in any other standard for milk and milk products, therefore the addition of the phrase regarding the legislation of the country of retail sale does not result in any inconsistency with similar provisions in standards for milk and milk products.
