

## FAO/WHO PROJECT AND TRUST FUND FOR ENHANCED PARTICIPATION IN CODEX

#### **SIXTH PROGRESS REPORT (JULY - DECEMBER 2005)**

#### A. INTRODUCTION

1. This is the sixth progress report on the FAO/WHO Project and Trust Fund for Enhanced Participation in Codex. It covers activities for the second half of 2005 and follows on from the information contained in the Fifth Progress Report (CAC/28 INF/12).

#### **B. TECHNICAL SECTION**

#### 2005 Meeting Participation

- 2. For the period January to October 2005 198 delegates from 83 countries were supported to attend 14 Codex meetings. The breakdown of participants was: 53% from LDCs and other lower income countries; 30% from lower middle income countries; and 17% from upper middle income countries. Annex A provides details of the countries supported. Countries supported by the Trust Fund are required to submit concise but comprehensive reports outlining their activities before, during and after the meetings including the impact that attendance had on Codex activities at national level. An overall review and summary of the reports received is expected to be available in late 2005.
- 3. For the period November to December 2005, 56 delegates from 49 countries are expected to be supported to attend two Codex meetings. The expected breakdown of participants from November to December 2005 is: 37% from LDCs and other lower income countries; 49% from lower middle income countries; and 14% from upper middle income countries. Annex B provides details of this proposed support.

#### 2005 Codex Training

4. A Codex training course, based on the FAO/WHO Codex Training Package, is to be held immediately prior to the FAO/WHO Regional Conference on Food Safety for the Americas and the Caribbean, in Costa Rica from 6 to 9 December 2005. It is expected that the Trust Fund will support participation of 60 attendees from eligible countries (mostly Low Income and Lower Middle Income Countries) from within the region.

#### 2006 Applications

5. Application forms for support by way of Codex meeting attendance, training and other activities in 2006 were made widely available through the Codex Email lists and via the WHO, FAO and Codex websites in July 2005. Applications will be considered by the Consultative Group for the Trust Fund (CGTF) and countries advised of the outcome of their applications before the end of 2005.

#### C. FINANCIAL SECTION

#### 2005 Finance

6. During the period January to September 2005 a total of US\$ 579,926 was received in contributions from Canada, the European Commission, and Germany. Table 1 provides the breakdown.

7. Three additional contributions to the Trust Fund are expected in 2005. These are:

<u>Sweden</u>: A 3-year Agreement for the 2005-2007 period has been finalized, which will entail a Swedish Government contribution of SEK 3.0 million per year (approximately US\$ 385,600 per year), thereby resulting in the contribution of US\$ 385,600 for 2005.

<u>Netherlands</u>: According to the 4-year Agreement (2003-2006), the Netherlands will contribute US\$ 50,000 in 2005.

<u>United States</u>: Advice has been received of a US\$ \$157,800 contribution to be made by the United States Government in 2005.

8. Total cost to the Codex Trust Fund for support in 2005 is estimated to be US\$ 2,033,000 (including administrative and management costs). The total average cost of supporting participants to Codex meetings, including all administrative functions related to the trust fund, is expected to be US\$ 6,400 per participant.

#### 2006 Finance

9. Four further contributions already pledged or expected in 2006 are estimated to total US\$ 833,400. While efforts continue to be made to secure other donations for 2006 and beyond, as at October 2005, a figure of US\$ 1,585,000 (including administrative and management costs) is being used to plan levels of participant support in 2006.

#### D. OTHER ISSUES

#### **Eligibility**

10. In 2005, Afghanistan joined Codex and immediately became eligible to apply for Trust Fund support, bringing the total number of eligible countries to 137. The eligibility of Codex members for support from the Trust Fund, the conditions and the various levels of support are all reviewed annually by the CGTF using the approved factors outlined in the Third Progress Report (CX/EXEC 04/53/3). Annex C details the latest grouping of the 137 eligible countries.

#### **Information Meeting**

- 11. An information meeting was held on 8 July 2005 in Rome, Italy (in conjunction with the 28th Session of the Codex Alimentarius Commission) primarily to provide a forum for an exchange of information and ideas on the FAO/WHO Codex Trust Fund. Over 100 participants from about 60 countries were present at the meeting. Presentations and comments were given by representatives of donor countries, beneficiary countries and members of the Consultative Group on the Trust Fund and these, together with some information material distributed at the meeting, generated considerable discussion. Many participants reported improved interagency co-operation and increased levels of Codex related activity within their countries as a direct result of the Trust Fund supported attendance at Codex meetings.
- 12. There was a very high level of support for the Trust Fund with an overall high level of satisfaction with its current operations. Many useful suggestions were made on ways that the Trust Fund could better meet the needs of developing countries. Continued support of developing countries' attendance at Codex meetings and working groups was clearly given a priority, with a range of views expressed on the level of support that the Trust Fund should give to training. Donor support for the Trust Fund was also high with one donor announcing a continuation of their funding in 2006.
