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- 1. As discussed at the 31st Session of the CCFAC (ALINORM 99/12A, paras. 140-143), proposals are being requested for additions or amendments to the Priority List of Food Additives and Contaminants for evaluation or re-evaluation by the Joint FAO/WHO Expert Committee on Food Additives (JECFA).
- 2. There are two Annexes to this Circular Letter:
 - ◆ Annex I outlines the selection criteria established by the JECFA for inclusion of additives and/or contaminants in the Codex Priority List; and
 - ♦ Annex II is the form in which information has to be provided. In completing Annex II, only brief information is required. The form may be retyped if more space is needed under any one heading provided that the general format is maintained.

CRITERIA FOR THE INCLUSION OF ADDITIVES AND/OR CONTAMINANTS IN THE PRIORITY LIST

In order to be placed on the JECFA priority list the candidate additive or contaminant should meet the following criteria:

For ADDITIVES:

- 1. Use of the compound in accordance with the general principles for the use of food additives (technological justification and need shall be indicated);
- 2. Commodities in which the compound will be used are in international trade and represent a significant portion of the diet;
- 3. Use of the compound will have potential to cause public health and/or trade problems;
- 4. The compound is commercially available; and
- 5. Commitment that a (full) dossier will be available for evaluation by the JECFA.

For CONTAMINANTS:

- 1. Commodities containing the compound are in international trade and represent a significant portion of the diet:
- 2. The occurrence of the compound in commodities will have potential to cause public health and/or trade problems;
- 3. Commitment that a dossier (as complete as possible) will be available for evaluation by the JECFA.
