GOVERNMENT COMMENTS

KENYA:

- 1) Kenya supports work of country of origin including the declaration of the origin of ingredients in response to the growing consumer's recognition that the quality of foods is related to their origins.
- 2) For non-processed foods the country of origin shall be declared whether its Genetically Modified Organism food or not.
- 3) For processed Genetically Modified Organism foods: when the product undergoes processing in a second country which changes its nature, then the country in which the processing is done shall become the country of origin for the purpose of labelling, and shall declare the GMO label.
