



Weather conditions and Time Zone



The weather in Acapulco is tropical; the average temperature is about 27°C and 28°C during all year. However; the nights are usually from 18°C to 19°C.

We advise you to use formal casual clothes.

Electrical System

The voltage in Mexico City is about 127 Volts + / - 10%, 60 Hz. The outlets are American type, which means the have a flat prong. Be aware that you may need an adapter, which some hotels may provide you.

Banking and currency exchange

It is recommended to change money at banks or authorized exchange houses because they provide a better exchange rate than some hotels and restaurants. Most establishments in Acapulco City only accept national currency. Likewise, there is a large number of banks that have ATMs that accept cards of the major international institutions such as Visa, MasterCard, Electron, Cirrus, American Express, Diner's and others.

1.0 Mexican Peso (s) = .092885

1.0 EUR = 15.726 Mexican Pesos

1.0 Mexican Pesos = .0635891 EUR

Credit Card

The generally accepted credit cards are American Express, Diners Club, Visa and MasterCard. They are accepted in most establishments like; restaurants, museums, department stores, theaters and other services.

Travelers Checks

To avoid additional commissions, it is advisable to use travelers checks rated in U.S. dollars or euros, if they are issued by banks and travel agencies internationally recognized, they can be exchanged at banks and hotels.

Transportation

Acapulco International Airport, an airport is located approximately 26 km from the city of Acapulco on the Pacific coast of Mexico. The terminal is one of the 15 largest airports in Mexico, in terms of passengers and operations. It has all the services for passengers, including VIP lounges and restaurants. Approximately Airport is 25 minutes from the Hotel headquarters (Copacabana).

Upon arrival at the Acapulco International Airport be aware to only use licensed taxis. Their rates are determined by destination, and tickets can be purchased in booths clearly identified in the baggage claim area and major departures from the airport. As in any city in the world, one of the basic security measures for visitors is to avoid addressing taxis on the streets. To move from anywhere in the city you can use the radio service taxis or those who are parked in special areas called "sitios". These offer a safe trip at reasonable prices. It is advisable to call for a taxi at restaurants, hotels and similar establishments. For safety, to take a taxi in the street be sure that the taxi driver's identification is on sight, as well as the taximeter.

Welcome to Acapulco Guerrero, Mexico

Acapulco de Juarez in Nahuatl means: Acatlan, Polo, co, 'reeds, destroy or pull, place' 'In the place it was bulldozed and destroyed the reeds' is a Mexican port city and located in the State of Guerrero, the southwest of the country, and whose semicircular bay was named Santa Lucia, for the day of its discovery by Spanish sailors. It is one of the major tourist destinations in the world.



Acapulco, the port plays a very important role, because it is considered a cornerstone of international trade since the days of the sixteenth century.

The Fortress of San Diego in 1616, thus was created, to take care of the boats carrying the silver and precious stones from the pirates who roamed the area



La Quebrada. It is one of the most famous attractions of the port of Acapulco. It is a cliff 45 meters high, where the famous nailed commonly made by young people from the port.

It is danger that the diver must calculate the time when the wave makes at the sea levels be higher, otherwise it would be certain death due to hit rock bottom, at a depth where the low sea level due to the waves.



The Fortress of San Diego. It is the most important historical monument in the port of Acapulco, Guerrero fortitude and the most important sea throughout the Pacific Ocean. An essential part of the face and history of the port it is unique trace geometric shape of a turtle.



Park Ignacio Manuel Altamirano, better known as the Parque Papagayo, is a comprehensive ecological reserve, full recreation and tourism. It has an area of 218,000 square meters and houses in addition to extensive green areas and three artificial lakes, large numbers of alien species in captivity. On the other hand, the park has recreational sites for children as it is a fair, sports, a skating rink, a library, among many others.



The House of the Mask. It is a museum that displays various masks of the seven regions of the state of Guerrero and Puebla, Morelos and Michoacan and also of the world. It has more than one thousand pieces of two types: those of Decorative and those used by Dancers.
