MATTERS FOR INFORMATION

New work for Potential NRV for Potassium in relation to the Risk of NCD¹

1. The Commission approved the elaboration of new work for Potential NRV for Potassium in relation to the Risk of NCD

Guidance on information documents

- 2. The 37th Session of the Codex Alimentarius Commission (July 2014) agreed to forward guidance on information documents to all Committees as recommended by CCGP28.2 The guidance on information documents is attached as **Appendix I** to this document.
- 3. The Committee is invited to note the approved new work and the guidance in para.1 & 2 above.

MATTERS FOR ACTION

General Principles for the Addition of Essential Nutrients to Foods (CAC/GL 9-1987)³

- 4. The Commission adopted the proposed draft General Principles at Step 5. The Delegation of Norway, supported by Chile stated that from a public health perspective, nutrient addition to energy-dense and nutrient-poor foods should be avoided and requested that CCNFSDU reconsider this issue referring to their proposals in CRD20.
- 5. One Delegation noted that the term "fortification" should be retained as fortification had scientific basis and was widely used as a major intervention.
- 6. This matter is to be considered under Agenda item 3.

Standard for ready-to-use foods for the management of malnourished children⁴

- 7. The Observer from UNICEF, referring to CRD2, requested the Commission to consider developing a standard for ready-to-use foods for the management of malnourished children. The observer explained that UNICEF and WFP provide nutritional foods, such as ready-to-use therapeutic Food (RUTF) and ready-to-use supplementary food (RUSF) to manage severe acute malnutrition and moderate acute malnutrition of children. Currently, no international standards were in place to provide guidance for the quality and safety of RUTF and RUSF.
- 8. In view of the support to consider the work further as well as the need to better understand the scope and key concerns, the Commission agreed to request UNICEF, in collaboration with WHO and FAO, to prepare a comprehensive discussion paper for presentation and discussion at the next session of CCNFSDU.
- 9. This Committee is invited to consider this matter.

STRATEGIC PLAN 2014-2019

10. The 37th Session of the Commission (July 2014) endorsed the conclusions and recommendations of the 69th Session of the Executive Committee⁵ to establish a monitoring framework for the implementation of the Strategic Plan including mechanisms for systematic data collection (e.g. templates) to make assessing information from multiple committees easier where these were the main providers of monitoring information.⁶

11. In order to monitor the implementation of the strategic plan, the Committee is invited to provide replies to the activities of relevance as indicated in the provisional template attached at **Appendix II** to this document.

B. MATTERS ARISING FROM OTHER CODEX COMMITTEES AS RELATED TO THE WORK OF THE COMMITTEE

69TH SESSION OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (CCEXEC)

Committee on Nutrition and Foods for Special Dietary Uses (CCNFSDU)

Proposal to Review the Standard for Follow-up Formula

- 12. The Executive Committee noted that while this work was scheduled for completion by 2017, follow-up formula and a Codex standard for these products required discussion before the work could proceed.
- 13. The Executive Committee acknowledged the intervention of WHO and noted that the work was proceeding within its schedule with a target for completion by 2017. The Executive Committee noted further that the CCNFSDU had undertaken the development of a discussion paper to consider the scope of the revision and the need for a standard. The Executive Committee recommended that the CCNFSDU consider WHO's concerns in its further deliberations on this issue.

This matter will be considered under Agenda item 6.

<u>Proposed Draft Amendment to the Standard for Processed Cereal-Based Foods for Infants and Young Children to include a new Part B for Underweight Older Infants and Young Children</u>

- 14. The Executive Committee noted that this work was behind schedule and that CCNFSDU was reconsidering the scope.
- 15. The Executive Committee encouraged CCNFSDU to confirm the scope of the work including the need for the standard, taking into account the guidance provided by WHO.
- 16. This matter will be considered under Agenda item 5.

Committee on Methods of Analysis and Sampling⁷

- 17. With regard to the general methods for dietary fibre that measure both the higher and the lower molecular weight fraction, the Committee noted that in addition to the currently adopted Type I methods (AOAC 2009.01|AACCI 32-45.01)⁸; AACCI 32-50.01|AOAC 2011.25 is available. The Observer from AACC International suggested that it should be classified as Type I if included in the Codex system. The Committee recalled that more than one Type I method cannot be endorsed for the same provision unless their scopes are different. The Committee agreed to request CCNFSDU to consider whether the new method (AACCI 32-50.01|AOAC 2011.25) should be included in the Standard and if so, how it should be accommodated.
- 18. The Committee is requested to provide guidance to CCMAS on this matter.

Committee on Food Additives

ALIGNMENT OF FOOD ADDITIVE PROVISIONS OF COMMODITY STANDARDS AND RELEVANT PROVISIONS OF THE GSFA

- 19. The 45th CCFA agreed to use the amended Decision-tree Approach to Alignment of the GSFA and Commodity Standards Food Additive Provisions for its future work on alignment. The decision-tree was intended for internal use of CCFA only.⁹
- 20. The Committee is requested to take note of this matter.

Appendix I

Guidance on information documents

- i. It is recognised that there is the occasional need for Codex committees to make available information documents, however Codex committees should not deliberately develop such documents and these documents should be by-products of ongoing work of the Committee.
- ii. Documents are considered to be information documents if they:
 - Have been developed and agreed upon by a Codex committee;
 - Have been determined by the Committee to contain information that is useful to national governments and/or Codex members and observers and Codex committees; and
 - Are not considered appropriate by the Committee to be adopted as Codex standards, guidelines or codes of practice or as recommendations for inclusion in the Procedural Manual.
- iii. Information documents will be made available on the Codex website of the relevant committee, clearly separated from official Codex documents and adopted texts.
