NOTES ON THE PROVISIONAL AGENDA

for the Nineteenth Session of the Codex Committee on Cocoa Products and Chocolate Fribourg, Switzerland, 3 - 5 October 2001

- **Item 1** Adoption of the Agenda (CX/CPC 01/1): In accordance with Rule V.2 of the Rules of Procedure, the first item on the Provisional Agenda shall be the adoption of the Agenda.
- Item 2 Matters Referred by the Codex Alimentarius Commission and Other Codex Committees (CX/CPC 01/2): The Committee will consider matters referred to it by the 24th Session of the Codex Alimentarius Commission and the Extraordinary 49th Session of the Executive Committee and other Codex Committees which met since the 18th Session of the Committee (November 2000). Matters which have implications for the work of the Committee will also be presented.
- Item 3 Proposed Draft Standard for Chocolate and Chocolate Products (ALINORM 01/14, Appendix V; CX/CPC 01/3): At its 18th Session the Committee decided to continue the elaboration of the Draft Standard for Chocolate and Chocolate Products. It agreed to include a provision allowing the use 5% of vegetable fats other than cocoa butter in manufacturing chocolate products recognizing that this introduction was based on a more general compromise that included the need for labelling. The provisions which are in square brackets relate to the relevant sections on Labelling and Methods of Analysis.

The Codex Alimentarius Commission (24th Session, Geneva, 2-7 July 2001) was unable to examine the Proposed Draft Standard for Chocolate and Chocolate Products at Step 5 due to time constraints. The status of the Proposed Draft Standard will be decided at the Extraordinary 49th Session of the Executive Committee 26-27 September 2001.

- **Item 4 Other Business and Future Work**: In accordance with Rule V.5 of the Rules of Procedure, any Member of the Commission may propose the inclusion of specific items of an urgent matter. The Committee may propose to undertake new work which shall be in compliance with the Medium Term Objectives and subject to the approval by the Commission or its Executive Committee.
- **Item 5 Date and Place of the next Session:** The Chairperson will propose, on behalf of the host country, the tentative date and place of the next meeting.
- **Item 6 Adoption of the Report**: In accordance with Rule VIII.1 of the Rules of Procedure and established practice, the Committee shall adopt the report of its 19th Session, based on a draft provided by the Secretariat.
