Arrival Information

The RAMADA Hotel is only a 6-min walk away from the train station 'Bergedorf'.

Bergedorf is easy to reach by <u>public transportation</u>:



A station for the regional train network is located in front of Hamburg Airport. The railway station is called "Hamburg Airport". The regional train S1 (every 10 min) will take you from "Hamburg Airport" station to the main railway station (Hauptbahnhof) in Hamburg city where you have to change to the trains S2, S21 or RE1. You should buy a ticket (www.hvv.de/en/) for price category AB (3.20 € single).

Another option for reaching the venue is to take a taxi:

Hamburg-Bergedorf is located approximately 25 km from Hamburg Airport (HAM). By taxi, it takes approximately 40 minutes to the venue and costs around 50 €. Taxis are always available in front of the main arrival points.

Visa Information

Participants requiring a Schengen visa to enter Germany are advised to contact the competent embassies and consulates-general of the Federal Republic of Germany as soon as possible to apply for their visa.

Other Information

Climate

Temperatures tend to fall in December, with daily highs decreasing from 7°C to 4°C over the course of the month, exceeding 11°C or dropping below -2°C only one day in ten. Daily low temperatures range from -1°C to 2°C, falling below -7°C or exceeding 7°C only one day in ten. Rain and snow are not uncommon at this time of the year, so we advise participants to bring warm coats and umbrellas.

Currency

The Euro is the only currency accepted in Germany. Major credit cards are accepted in most hotels and stores. ATM machines are available at the airport as well as near the venue hotel. Currency exchange is available at the airport and in Hamburg City.

Electrical Current

Electricity in Germany is 230 Volts and 50 Hertz. Plugs of type C/F are required.



Language

The official language in Germany is German. English is widely spoken.


Time zone


Hamburg is in the Central European Time zone (CET), which is GMT/UTC +01:00 hour.

50 Years of CCNFSDU

This year we celebrate the 50th anniversary of the CCNFSDU. From the beginning Germany has been the host country. The first session took place in Freiburg im Breisgau in the year 1966.

Interesting facts





A huge increase from 30 participants representing 8 member countries and 3 observer organizations in the year 1966 to 292 participants from 66 member countries, 1 member organization and 36 observer organizations in 2015.

Co-hosted sessions



Hamburg



Hamburg is the second largest city in Germany and the eighth largest city in the European Union. Its population is over 1.7 million people, and the Hamburg Metropolitan Region has more than 5 million inhabitants. The city is situated on the river Elbe.

The official name reflects its history as a member of the medieval Hanseatic League, as a free imperial city of the Holy Roman Empire, a city-state, and one of the 16 states of Germany.

Hamburg is a transport hub, being the 2nd largest port in Europe, and is an affluent city in Europe. The city is a notable tourist destination for both domestic and overseas visitors; it ranked 16th in the world for livability in 2015. The ensemble Speicherstadt and Kontorhausviertel was declared a World Heritage Site by the UNESCO in July 2015.

The RAMADA Hotel is located in Hamburg-Bergedorf, the largest of the seven boroughs of Hamburg, located in the east. Bergedorf offers a nice historical town center, the only castle in Hamburg and lovely, askew half-timbered buildings.

A sweeping view, a fresh breeze and plenty of light – hardly any other city has as many attractions and places of interest as Hamburg. Below you will find an overview of the most famous landmarks in Hamburg City:

Places of Interest

Hamburg Harbour

About 13,000 ships from all over the world call at Europe's second largest port. From the cruise ship terminal to the historic 'Speicherstadt' warehouse district and the landing bridges to the modern container port - aromas here are redolent of freedom and far-away lands. From the St Pauli Landungsbrücken you can also take a harbour boat trip on one of the barges that are so typical of Hamburg.

The "Michel"

St. Michaelis, the Lutheran main church in the southern part of the Neustadt, is affectionately known by locals as 'Michel' for short. The church was built between 1647 and 1669. Twice a day, at 10 am and 9 pm, you can hear trumpets playing from the 132m tower. It has been a tradition for 300 years and marks a moment of silence and contemplation for the local people. The observation deck of the church tower stands at a height of 106 metres and offers a panoramic view of the port and the city.

Town Hall

Built between 1886 and 1897, Hamburg's town hall dominates the city centre with its impressive architecture and its 112 metre-high tower. This magnificent sandstone Neo-Renaissance building is the seat of the Hamburg Senate and the Hamburg State Parliament. It has 647 rooms and its façade displays the statues of twenty kings and emperors of the old German Empire. The representative halls and back rooms can be viewed only on guided tours.





"Speicherstadt"

The "Speicherstadt", the world's largest integrated complex of warehouses, was built in 1883, five years before Hamburg received its free port. Since 1991, the unique district has been given historic monument protection. You can travel the narrow canals in small barges to savour the architectural details if the tide is right. A canal tour with a historic barge like this is an unforgettable experience.

St. Pauli and the "Reeperbahn"

The Reeperbahn, also called "Kiez" is and remains Hamburg's entertainment district number one. The theatre Operettenhaus, numerous table dance bars, nightclubs and student clubs - everything can be found on 930 meters! During the day rather quiet, the street awakens at night.
