Objectives

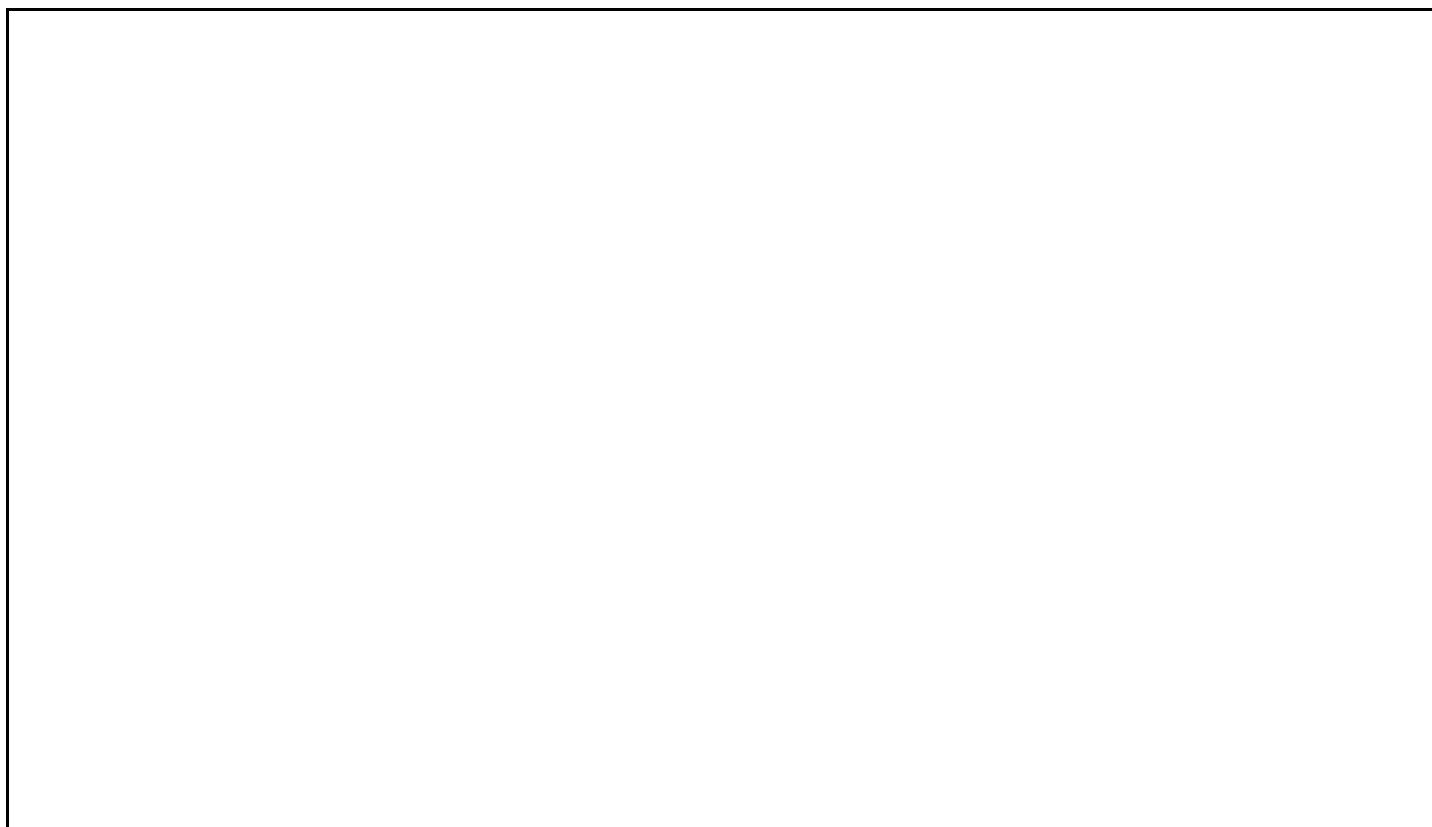
The objective of the Pacific Islands Forum Fisheries Agency (FFA) is to enable Member Countries to manage, conserve and use the tuna resources in their Exclusive Economic Zones and beyond, through enhancing national capacity and strengthening regional solidarity.

Area of competence

The FFA is an advisory body, providing support to its members for the conservation and management of living marine resources, in particular highly migratory species, within EEZs and the region.
