

# Main Outcomes of the High Level Plenary Meeting on the Millennium Development Goals

The three-day Summit culminated in the outcome document: *Keeping the Promise: United to Achieve the Millennium Development Goals*

The document reaffirms world leaders' commitment to the MDGs and sets out a concrete action agenda to achieve the Goals by 2015.

- Support to small scale producers, women
- Investment in agriculture

# Aspects to consider by CFS

- Increased emphasis on food security, agriculture and rural development
- Achievement of the hunger target means food security for another 500 million people.
- Policy debate and global awareness will support country level achievements

- HLTF and the CFA form part of UN system wide efforts to contribute to country level efforts to achieve MDG 1
- Annual report of the UN Secretary-General; annual reporting to ECOSOC on MDG implementation
- Enhanced role of non-governmental organizations, the private sector and other stakeholders in national development.
