TO ERRADICATE HUNGER IN ONE GENERATION

- Originally proposed by Brazil and Guatemala in 2005
- Became a priority of the countries in FAO's 29th Regional Conference. This was confirmed at the 30th and 31st Conferences.
- Received support from all Heads of State and Government during the XVI Ibero American Summit (2006) and the First and Second Latin American and the Caribbean Integration and Development Summits (2008 and 2010).
