

COMMENTS FROM WHO

First of all, we would like to express our support for a new HLPE note on critical and emerging issues for food security and nutrition by the end of 2017 to inform the work of the future OEWG on MYPOW.

Furthermore, the choice of having a HLPE report on multi-stakeholder partnerships for financing food security and nutrition is a timely and highly relevant topic in the framework of the 2030 Agenda. We appreciate the Chair's proposal on the HLPE report on multi-stakeholders partnerships to finance FS and N and would like to contribute the following for discussion:

- We would like to suggest the addition, that the report also looks at and identifies effective and innovative models of financing for FS and N. This could be added to para 19. Given the universal nature of the 2030 Agenda, this analysis would be independent of a country's FS and N problem and include countries from all regions of the world (also in line with para 23).
- As governments are paying more attention to the importance of linking policies and investments that integrate agriculture with improved nutrition and health, nutrition-sensitive investments and financing models can have positive nutritional impacts by increasing the quality and availability of agricultural commodities, as well as the quality of food in terms of diversity, nutrient content and safety. Therefore we would like to suggest that the report, besides addressing sustainable and responsible production patterns, could also especially look at partnerships for sustainable and responsible consumption for food security and improved nutrition. These can be public private, public private producers, or other type of partnerships.
- In para 16, we suggest to add the UN in the list of stakeholders.

In para 22, we would like to suggest, as also in line with the SDG2, that is saysto sustainable agriculture, food security and improved nutrition.....
