

## Draft Work Plan of the 2030 Agenda Workstream in 2018

### Extract from CFS 44 Final report

#### 23. The Committee:

(...)

d) Endorsed the document 2017/44/2 "CFS Contribution to the High Level Political Forum (HLPF) 2018 " as the basis for the contribution of CFS to the 2018 HLPF review "Transformation towards Sustainable and Resilient Societies"; and noted that it should be updated with the outcomes of CFS 44 discussions, including pending resolution of the paragraph on biofuels and latest international data and reports on food security and nutrition, including the State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World (SOFI) report, for finalization by the Bureau after consultation with the Advisory Group;

e) Decided to send inputs to the 2019 review of the HLPF held under the theme "Empowering People and Ensuring Inclusiveness and Equality", and requested that the Committee presents a contribution for consideration in CFS 45, in line with the decision in CFS 43, to be developed through an inclusive process in accordance with provisions foreseen in the Multi-Year Programme of Work (MYPoW) 2018-2019;

f) Encouraged all CFS stakeholders to increase their coordinated engagement at different levels in the follow-up and review process of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

### Extract from MYPoW 2018-2019

(...)

29. In line with the agreed strategy, the Committee will pursue its commitment to mainstream the SDGs in its workstreams, supported by specific activities:

- Sharing lessons and exchanging on good practices and challenges in advancing food security and nutrition and sustainable agriculture in the context of the 2030 Agenda implementation, building for instance on voluntary national reports to the High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF);
- Contributing to global follow-up and review efforts through interactions with the HLPF and thematic progress review discussions, based on UN monitoring reports.

32. The Committee will reflect on the way it develops inputs to the HLPF for 2019 and beyond, based on feedback received from its submission in 2016 and 2017. The Committee will consider continuing its engagement to HLPF reviews beyond 2019, based on the conclusions of the CFS evaluation follow-up as it relates to SDGs, and the update of the UNGA resolution on follow-up and review arrangements for the next HLPF cycle.

(...)

34. Contributions to the HLPF will be developed by the CFS Secretariat supported by a technical task team, based on substantive guidance on the issues to be prioritized resulting from an open meeting facilitated by a Member. The contributions will be finalized in a further open, facilitated meeting, and conveyed to the CFS Bureau in consultation with the Advisory Group after consideration in Plenary.



### I. OVERALL OBJECTIVES

1- Update the contribution to the **2018** High Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF) meeting held under the theme “Transformations towards sustainable and resilient societies” and reviewing in depth SDGs 6 (water), 7 (clean energy), 11 (sustainable settlements), 12 (sustainable production and consumption), 15 (land and forests) and 17 (means of implementation), based on the outcomes of CFS 44, for finalization by the Bureau after consultation with the Advisory Group.

The updates should be: outcomes of the CFS 44 discussion in item II.b “State of Food Security and Nutrition in the World” and latest international data and reports on food security and nutrition; inclusion of policy recommendations on sustainable forestry for food security and nutrition; agreement of the pending paragraph on biofuels.

2- Prepare a draft submission to the **2019** High Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development (HLPF) review under the theme “Empowering people and ensuring inclusiveness and equality” (in-depth review of SDGs 4, 8, 10, 13, 16 and 17) for consideration in CFS 45 Plenary.

The preparation of this submission can follow the “light format” adopted for the previous contribution.

3- Continue to mainstream SDGs in CFS work and activities, in particular by preparing a Voluntary National Review session in CFS 45 contributing both to CFS’ role in advancing the 2030 Agenda, and country needs.

### II. EXPECTED OUTCOME

- Contribution to the 2018 HLPF review agreed and conveyed to NY by the CFS Chair.
- Contribution to the 2019 HLPF review prepared for consideration and finalization in CFS 45.
- Proposal to Bureau and Advisory Group of format and programme for Voluntary National Review session in CFS 45
- Proposal to Bureau and Advisory Group of format and programme for overall progress review session in CFS 45.

#### IV. TECHNICAL TASKTEAM

A technical taskteam, comprising individuals designated by Advisory Group representatives, will support the CFS Secretariat with the updates of the 2018 contribution, and with the drafting of the 2019 contribution.

The taskteam members should be nominated on the basis of their technical background and expertise, which should be of relevance to the topic of the annual theme and SDGs under review. They participate in their individual capacity. They take responsibility for drafting the contributions for discussion in the inclusive meetings, contribute suggestions for the agendas of the open meetings and if relevant, Bureau meetings, and support coordination and foster synergies between their organization's SDG related activities/relevant processes leading up to the High Level Political Forum review, and CFS work, to support CFS to deliver on its engagement to advance the 2030 Agenda through its mandate and roles.
