

## **CFS Intersessional events (Ranked as per interest)**

### **1. Nutrition-sensitive agriculture (incl. nutrition-sensitive value chains)**

Of course, for IFAD this is a priority. However, nutrition-sensitive agriculture has been intensively discussed in the past and the added value as a CFS intersessional event would come in as a kind of stock-taking exercise: What have we achieved; where are we now; which indicators do we use to measure progress; did nutrition-sensitive value chains make a difference for nutrition; what is still difficult to be tackled; what is the way forward;

This might be combined with 'Food transformation'

### **2. Adolescent girls and Nutrition**

As IFAD will host an event on the same other with Save the Children and potentially other partners in September, this might be a good opportunity to present the topic and issues to a broader audience. There will be at least two major events before the CFS: One will be in June in Ottawa and building on this the event in September in Rome. It would be a good opportunity for the intersessional event to present and discuss the results of at least the two conferences mentioned.

### **3. HLPE report on Nutrition and Food Systems**

There are definitively some segments in the report which need a closer look and discussion. Would be good to have some proposed segments for the decision.

On proposal 7 '**School Feeding and Nutrition**' – I would suggest to use the terminology we agreed among UNSCN and RBA working groups, namely 'School meals' or 'School based interventions in nutrition'.

I am not sure if this is a good topic for CFS. First of all, there have been quite a number of events on this. I personally think that school meal programmes are still presented too positive (of course context and country specific) and I do not really see an added value for CFS in this discussion.
