




# Place of SSPARS in the National Statistical System

- SSPARS building blocks of NSDS
- Only 43 of 78 (55%) IDA countries have planned to include agriculture into NSDS
- •Of these only 4-10 have included agriculture appropriately Paris21 (2008)

The following scheme depicts the relationship between the main components of the system:









## **Relation of SSPARS to Global Strategy**

- Pillar 2: Integration of agriculture into the national statistical system
- Integration allows understanding of impact of agriculture on other sectors – poverty, national accounts, environment
- Coordination of the collection and analysis of agricultural data
  - Avoids duplication of effort and expense
  - Provides consistent statistics among producers







## **Relation of Global Strategy to SSPARS**

#### Minimum core data set:


- Key starting point for SSPARS discussion with stakeholders
- Countries decide core data items to collect and for which products (e.g. maize, livestock)

#### <u>Integration of Agriculture into NSS</u>

- Broader conception of agriculture cuts across social and environmental sectors leads to
- Consideration of mechanisms for integration: legal framework, mechanisms for coordination (e.g. National Statistical Council), common systems for dissemination

## **Relation of Global Strategy to SSPARS**

- GS will inform the framework and strategic goals of the SSPARS
- Core data selected will inform strategies for statistical data collections and analysis and necessary human and material resources
- In depth country assessment forms part of the SSPARS assessment phase







#### **Current Activities**

- SSPARS pilots Peru, Mozambique, Laos completed
  - Mozambique: High Council on Statistics, chaired by Prime Minister approves the Master Plan for Agricultural Statistics
  - Peru SSPARS approved by Office of Economic and Statistics Studies - Ministry of Agriculture (MINAG)
  - Laos sector plan pilot
- Ongoing
  - Tanzania
  - Malawi
