
Established in 1959 to: build & maintain human knowledge, skills & biological resources in support of horticulture worldwide







- Arose from Global Horticultural Assessment in 2004.
- A 2 year global programme funded by USAID
- Organised by Univ. of California, Davis; Purdue Univ.; Michigan State Univ.; Univ. of Hawaii; AVRDC the World Vegetable Centre.

Proposed: A Collaborative Research Support Program in Horticulture


 Designed to provide the research, capacity building and knowledge extension support essential for development of the global horticulture sector

- Formally launched in Montpellier 2006.
- Appointed an Executive Officer in July 2007
- Located in Arusha, Tanzania in collaboration with the World Vegetable Centre
- Heavy involvement in lobbying and creation of IT capability since then.
