Creating resilient mountain habitats

The power of mountain rural planning is often overlooked. Its absence leads to uncontrolled, climatically, and seismically unfit construction, transforming mountain villages into peri-urban concrete extensions, devoid of identity and sustainable resources. These challenges are intensified by climate change and hazards: from earthquakes to rock falls, through to uncontrolled glacial, river and lake outbursts. Seismically resilient, climatically suited buildings coupled with sustainable, risk-sensitive land-use planning is not only critical to long-term sustainability of the environment but is also the crux of safety and sustainability.

This session will showcase how resilient planning can be scaled through rural mountain planning methods, integrating community engagement, data-driven decision-making, and spatial design. The discussion will touch upon the intersection of climate-change, hazard mitigation, the implications of long-term development interventions and mechanisms to leverage innovations at scale.

BAHAR DUTT Environmental Journalist @bahardutt

Ms. Bahar Dutt is an award-winning environment journalist who has reported some of the biggest stories of our times over the last two decades. She currently teaches as an Associate Professor at Shiv Nadar University and manages multimedia projects for the United Nations Development Fund (UNDP) – India, United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD) and the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP). Ms. Dutt has also worked as an Environment Editor with India's leading English news channel, CNN-IBN, and her reportage has helped move environment reportage from an obtuse segment on television to the prime-time news space.

For her reportage on green issues, she has won over twelve national and international awards. She is the author of two books, 'Green Wars – Dispatches from a Vanishing World' by Harper Collins and 'Rewilding in India' by Oxford University Press.



MS. MARIASTELLA GELMINI Minister for Regional Affairs and Autonomies, Government of Italy

Ms. Mariastella Gelmini is the Minister for Regional Affairs and Autonomies, Government of Italy. Prior to holding this office, Minister Gelmini was the President of the Forza Italia parliamentary group in the chamber of deputies. A law graduate specialised in administrative law, she began her political career in 1998, when she was elected to the Municipality of Desenzano del Garda as a member of the Forza Italia.

She was elected as the councillor of the Province of Brescia for Territory in 2002 and for Agriculture in 2004. In 2006, she was elected at the Chamber of Deputies during the XV legislature, where she was member of the council for the authorizations to proceed, of the parliamentary committee for the procedures of indictment and of II Justice Committee.

In 2008 she was reconfirmed at the Chamber of Deputies in Lombardy II area in the lists of 'Popolo della Libertà" for the XVI legislature and was elected minister of education, university and scientific research in the IV Berlusconi's Government. In 2015, she was elected as the President of the Garda Community and was elected as the City Councilor of Milan in June 2016.





MR. MAURIZIO MARTINA,
Assistant Director General – Special Advisor
Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO)

Mr. Maurizio Martina, a national of Italy, is Special Adviser to the Director-General of the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) at the level of Assistant Director-General. From 2018 until joining FAO in January 2021, he served as Member of the Italian Parliament in the House of Representatives. Prior to this, he was Minister of Agriculture, Food and Forestry of the Italian Government (2014 – 2018), held responsibilities in the Committee of Coordination for the Universal Exposition of Milan (2015), was Undersecretary of State for Agriculture of the Italian Government (2013-2014) and was elected Councilor of the Lombardy Region (2010-2013).

He also served as Secretary of the Democratic Party (2018). During his term in office as Minister of Agriculture, Mr. Martina was, inter alia, President of the meeting of Agriculture Ministers of the G7 in Bergamo, Italy, and President of the European Council of Ministers of Agriculture (Brussels). Moreover, he participated in several high-level meetings, including the Meeting of the Agriculture Ministers of the G7 Countries in Niigata (Japan) and the Meeting of the Agriculture Ministers of the G20 in Istanbul (Turkey).



MR. PAOLO DI CROCE Secretary General of Slow Food International @SlowFoodHQ

After receiving his degree as an environmental engineer from Turin's Polytechnic in Italy, Mr. Paolo Di Croce started his career in Slow Food in 1999, serving as the General Secretary of the Slow Food Foundation for Biodiversity from 2003 to 2007, which defends the biodiversity of our foods and gastronomic traditions from the world over, promotes sustainable agriculture, respect for the environment, for cultural identities, and for the wellbeing of animals.

He also served as the General Secretary of Slow Food International since the Puebla Congress, and was reappointed for a second and third term in 2012 and 2017. Mr. Di Croce played a pivotal role in the organization of the first edition of Terra Madre in 2004, serving as the General Secretary of the Terra Madre Foundation from 2005 until 2014. He currently serves as the Secretary General of Slow Food since 2007 and leads the Slow Food Executive Committee.





MR. MARIO CERUTTI
Chief Institutional Relations and Sustainability
Officer and Secretary of the Lavazza Foundation

Born in Torino, Italy, Mr. Mario Cerutti has been working in Lavazza since 1986, where he is currently the Chief Institutional Relations and Sustainability Officer and Secretary of the Lavazza Foundation.

He also serves as President of the Institute for Scientific Information on Coffee (ISIC), as President of Italian Coffee Committee (CIdC – Comitato Italiano del Caffè) – the association of large Italian coffee companies and as Chairman of the Coffee & Climate Steering Committee. Additionally, he is a board member of the International Coffee Partners (ICP) and World Coffee Reasearch (WCR). From 2004 to 2007 and again from 2017 to 2020, he was President of the European Coffee Federation (ECF).

Mr. Cerutti studied Business Administration at the University of Torino in Italy and has an MBA in International Finance from the University of Dallas in the United States.

Ms. Anita Paul is a social entrepreneur engaged with promotion of gender inclusive sustainable development strategies in the Indian Himalayan Region. In 1992, she co-founded the Pan Himalayan Grassroots Development Foundation, a voluntary organization which spearheads holistic mountain development through active engagement of communities. For the past three decades, she has been passionately advocating inclusion of Mountain Agenda in the global discourse on sustainable development. Ms. Paul also participates on forums promoting Fair Trade and climate resilient responsible Food Systems.

Alongside, she has been developing global voluntary labelling systems for high value niche mountain products from the world of the mountains in collaboration with Mountain Partnership Secretariat, hosted by Food & Agriculture Organization of the United Nations at Roma. She represents Asia, as a member of the Board for International Association for Community Development (IACD) which is a global network of community development practitioners.





MR. APOORVA OZA Chief Executive Officer of Aga Khan Rural Support Programme, India (AKRSPI)

Mr. Apoorva Oza is the Chief Executive Officer of Aga Khan Rural Support Programme, India (AKRSPI) and was appointed to this role in 2001. Besides his work with AKRSPI, Mr. Oza is actively involved in founding and supporting non-governmental organizations (NGOs) and NGO networks as well as influencing government policies. He is interested in supporting initiatives which address the human resource needs of rural India.

He is a mechanical engineer by training with a diploma in rural management from the Institute of Rural Management, Anand (IRMA). He also holds degrees on strategic change from Cranford University, United Kingdom, and Cornell University, USA.

Ms. Tsechu Dolma is the founder of Mountain Resiliency Project, a social enterprise dedicated to strengthening mountain communities in South Asia. Leveraging her education and experience, Ms. Dolma returned to the refugee camps she grew up in to fight for a sustainable future in the high mountains of Asia.

Her track record has been recognized by the Asia Society Young Leaders, Forbes 30 under 30 in social entrepreneurship, and Brower Youth Award. Ms. Dolma has led several projects with the US State Department, United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), and World Wide Fund for Nature (WWF). Trained at Oxford University and Columbia University, she is a Skoll Scholar, Fulbright Hillary Clinton Public Policy Fellow, Udall Scholar, and Echoing Green Fellow.

Ms. Tea Hoxha is a twenty-one-year-old student of Political Science and International Relations at the University of Padua. In addition to cultivating her passion for art and humanities, Ms. Hoxha has been actively participating in a variety of events and initiatives such as cultural exchanges and collaborations with the FA as well as UN simulations and hackathons.

Mr. Stefano Sala is currently working as a Project Officer atGe.S.Di.Mont. He is experienced in working on interdisciplinary research projects for the development of mountain areas, with a specific focus on governance issues and policies for sustainable mountain development and tourism.

Mr. Sala has also been supporting the coordination of the EU-Strategy for the Alpine Region (EUSALP) Action Group 1 to develop an effective research and innovation ecosystem with the objective of promoting coherent R&I policies at the regional, national and transnational level. He is part of the board of directors of the Italian chapter of the International Commission for the Protection of the Alps (CIPRA) and is an active member of civil society, collaborating with several non-governmental organizations for the sustainable development of mountain areas.





MS. STELLA JEAN Fashion Designer @STELLAJEAN_SJ

Ms. Stella Jean is a renowned fashion designer and is recognized as the first black Italian designer. She created and built a business model and sustainable development platform entitled Laboratorio delle Nazioni (LDN), which focuses on a standard of sustainability and multiculturalism applied to the fashion industry and uses fashion as a tool for cooperative international development. In 2021, Ms. Jean along with Michelle Ngonmo and Edward Buchanan, founded a work group comprised of Afro-Italian professionals: WAMI - We Are Made in Italy, in conjunction with the National Chamber of Italian Fashion (CNMI). In 2014, Ms. Jean attended as a speaker on the 'Power of Empowered Women' at the Palace of United Nations and, on the same day, presented her garments created in collaboration with the United Nations ethical fashion program at the World Trade Organization (WTO). That year, she also presented her creations within the 'Fashion 4 Development' project, organised in collaboration with the UN Millennium Development Goals. As a measure of her work and success, she was highlighted by the New York Times as the most convincing of all the New Gen designers in Milan in 2019 and was nominated by the Business of Fashion as one of the 'People Shaping the Global Fashion Industry in 2014' in the annually published ranking list 'BOF 500'.




MS. KIRA INTRATOR Lead, Habitat Planning and Innovation, Aga Khan Agency for Habitat @kiraintrator

Ms. Kira Intrator leads urban and rural planning and innovation for the Aga Khan Agency for Habitat (AKAH), supporting teams in Afghanistan, India, Pakistan, Syria, and Tajikistan. Her work focuses on creating and refining innovative digital tools, methods and practices that exponentially scale impact on urban planning and development. Her projects include designing an award-winning, post-disaster Interactive Voice Response prototype for emergency relief with Google's Civic Response team, creating an AI data capture design to enhance real-time urban demographic data collection, and piloting a satellite and open data 'Habitat Assessment' tool for urban planning in Central Asia.

She has also raised \$18million in VC-style growth capital to train and place underserved young adults in jobs in IT and investment operations for a US based social enterprise, which allowed her to lead the organization's expansion to new offices in Chicago and Seattle. In her 15 years of experience, Ms. Intrator has managed urban planning programs, created digital products for development, and executed strategic management consulting projects for UN Agencies, government ministries, foreign aid agencies, academia, foundations, and multilaterals.





MR. KARIM KHOJA CEO Industrial Promotion Services, Asia Region (Afghanistan, Pakistan, Tajikistan)

Mr. Karim Khoja is currently working as the Chief Executive Officer of Industrial Promotion Services (IPS) – Asia Region. Prior to this role, he was the Chief Executive Officer of Roshan and under his leadership, Roshan grew to be Afghanistan's leading telecommunications provider, with more than six and a half million customers. He has over twenty-five years of experience in the telecommunications industry, which has included starting and managing extremely successful GSM companies in Pakistan, Poland, Croatia, Tajikistan and Afghanistan. Over the course of nineteen years, he has dedicated his time to the Aga Khan Fund for Economic Development (AKFED) to bring competition and best practices to the telecommunication industry in Afghanistan and Tajikistan.

Mr. Khoja serves on the board of IPS West Africa, IPS Pakistan and Tcell in Tajikistan, and the executive committee of Accelerator Prosperity. He has a Bachelor's degree in Biochemistry from Chelsea College at the University of London, a Master's degree in Management Science from Imperial College London and an Advanced Management Program (AMP) from Harvard Business School.



PROF. ROY C. SIDLE
Director of the Mountain Societies Research Institute (MSRI)

Prof. Roy C. Sidle is currently working as the Director of the Mountain Societies Research Institute (MSRI) and Professor of Earth & Environmental Sciences at the University of Central Asia (UCA) inKhorog, Tajikistan. He has forty-nine years of research, teaching, outreach and leadership experience in hydrology, environmental science, sustainability, and natural resources management; and much of his research has focused on mountain ecosystems across the world. Prior to joining UCA in 2018, he served as Director of the Sustainability Research Centre at the University of the Sunshine Coast in Australia and has held the post of Distinguished Professor at Tokyo University of Agriculture & Technology since 2017.

As measures of his scientific contributions and success, Professor Sidle was elected as a Fellow in American Geophysical Union in 2010 and received the International Award from the Japan Society of Hydrology and Water Resources in 2014. He holds a PhD in Soil Science/Hydrology from the Pennsylvania State University and MSc and BSc degrees from the University of Arizona.
