Highlights of the week

Policy

The government of India has allowed exports of non-basmati rice under open general licence, and did not impose a Minimum Export Price (MEP). Export of rice and wheat will be stopped once shipments reach two million tonnes each. This follows a complete ban on exports of non-basmati rice export imposed was allowed only with MEP in April 2008, which was partially lifted earlier this year when some South Indian varieties were allowed for export (Agricommodityprices.com, 09 November 2011).

In Thailand, main-season paddy production for 2011/2012 is revised down to 21.6 MMT (originally 25.1 MMT), down 2.7 percent from the previous year, due to higher-than-expected production losses of 1.6 million ha of crop land from extensive flooding. However, a bumper off-season crop is anticipated, which will likely offset the losses. Consequently, total rice production for 2011/2012 is expected to remain higher than the previous year by 1.3 percent. The Paddy Pledging Programme* will likely be more aggressive by mid November when main-crop paddy in the Northeast region will be harvested (US Department of Agriculture Foreign Service, 02 November 2011).

* After the abolition of agricultural export taxes in 1986, the paddy pledging programme has become the cornerstone of Thailand's agricultural policy. The paddy pledging policy was first introduced in 1981-1982 cropping season when its major objective was to provide soft loans for farmers who wanted to delay sale of their crops. In 2001-2002 the objective changed towards supporting prices in order to increase farmers' income. The objective for 2011 remains the same; however, pledging prices have been set above the highest price observed in 2008 (between US\$ 460-US\$ 600 per tonne depending on the variety pledged).

Prices

Over the past week food staple commodities remained relatively except for:

- In Fiji, despite a 10 percent increase in cassava prices during the last week of October, prices were 15 percent below those recorded a month ago. Prices of dalo tausala taro increased significantly by nearly 22 percent over the past week, and were nearly 40 percent above the prices observed a year ago.

Weather conditions


- Cambodia, Lao, Myanmar, Pakistan, Philippines, Thailand and Viet Nam continue to be affected from floods resulting from heavy monsoon rains in the past 2 months.
- The most recent update for Cambodia indicates that more than 10 percent of the rice crop was destroyed and fears of food shortages and personal debt increases.
- In Viet Nam, floods hit central provinces over the past week (Alert Net, Government of Viet Nam, 4 and 8 November 2011).
- A recent forecast by the Climate Prediction Center indicate that Myanmar will experience a warm and dry winter through to February, despite the return of La Niña (Myanmar Times, 07 November 2011).

AFGHANISTAN, Kabul (31 October 2011 2011)

Retail nominal prices

Country Highlights

- Rice prices increased by nearly 3 percent over the past week and were 5 percent above prices last month.
- Maize prices fell by nearly 3 percent and have shown a downward movement since June 2011.
- Chicken prices showed no change from the previous week. Still, prices have been gradually decreasing during the past 3 months.





Country Highlights

- Rice prices remained unchanged from last week reported. However, rice mix prices reached a record high in late October, at 9 percent higher than prices recorded a month ago, and 29 percent higher than a year ago.
- At the end of October, Phakar Khney and Neangminh rice varieties were 12 and 13 percent higher than 3 months ago.



Policy+


- China's Cabinet approved a national anti-drought plan that will construct facilities to provide water for drinking and irrigation in drought-affected regions. The plan will be implemented over the next 10 years (Xinhua, 02 November 2011).
- World Agricultural Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE) reported that China's 2011/12 rice crop is raised 2 MMTto a record 141 MMT, due to an increase in harvested area (Agri Pulse, 09 November 2011).

Country Highlights

- Corn prices remained stable over the past week; however they have been highly volatile over the past year, and are currently 17 percent below the prices observed a year ago.
- Cassava prices increased by 10 percent during the past week, and were 15 percent below prices recorded a month ago.
- Prices of dalo tausala taro increased significantly by nearly 22 percent over the past week, and are nearly 40 percent above the prices observed a year ago.




INDIA, Delhi (07 November 2011)



- Soybean prices are 4.6 percent higher the prices observed a year ago.






MYANMAR, Yangon and Mandalay (07 November 2011)

- Palm oil prices continue to drop gradually since April 2011. Currently they are 5 percent below the prices recorded a month ago.



Policy+


- The newly established Ministry of Agriculture is tasked to perform food related economic coordination and planning, quality control and assurance of food related imports and exports, collection of agricultural related statistics (production, consumption, prices, imports and exports of food grains), and coordination with aid/assistance agencies in respect of food sector. Enhancing the availability of fertilizers is also a priority (Right Vision News, 06 November 2011).

Country Highlights

- Rice prices remained stable over the past month, while the prices for regular milled rice are 2.6 percent below the prices recorded a year ago.

Policy+

- The Department of Agriculture has launched a PHP 192 million (US \$ 4.4 million) community seed bank (CSB) and seed production program (Department of Agriculture, 01 November 2011).
- Despite the typhoon damage, government estimates that total rice production this year is likely to be a record 17.3 MMT. The government is considering imports of 500,000 MT next year. (Business World and Manila Bulletin, 4 and 5 November 2011).






SRI-LANKA, Colombo (07 November 2011)



Policy+

- The Paddy Pledging Program began on October 7, 2011 and has pledged 341,897 MT of paddy which account for approximately 1.4 percent of the total production. The program will likely be more aggressive by mid November when maincrop paddy in the Northeast region will be harvested, which accounts for half of the total main-crop production, and consists mostly of fragrant and glutinous rice (US Department of Agriculturet, 02 November 2011).



Policy+

- The rice festival started this week and it is expected to help further promote Soc Trang scented rice, which has received trademark recognition from the National Office of Intellectual Property and in both local and international markets (Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, 09 November 2011).
- As a result from a bumper crop of skipjack tuna, prices dropped from VND 35,000 per kg to VND 30,000 kg (from US \$1.6 to US \$1.4) (Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, 08 November 2011).
