PREPARATION FOR THE 25th SESSION OF THE ASIA-PACIFIC FORESTRY COMMISSION

a) Introduction

- 1. The twenty-fourth session of the Asia-Pacific Forestry Commission (APFC) noted with appreciation the offer of the delegation from New Zealand to host its twenty-fifth session. The FAO Director-General welcomed and concurred with the New Zealand offer. The twenty fifth session of the Asia-Pacific Forestry Comission will, consequently, be held 4- 8 November 2013 at the Rotorua Events Centre in Rotorua, New Zealand.
- 2. The APFC Secretariat has been working with the Ministry of Primary Industries, New Zealand on preliminary planning for the session and text of the Hosting Memorandum of Understanding has been agreed for signature.
