The Vision

- Aim for measurable progress on five Strategic Objectives and one Objective on technical quality through:
 - more focused use of resources
 - translating normative work for greater impact at country level
 - maintaining and enhancing technical quality
 - performance monitoring and evaluation
- Put in place new ways of working
 - empowered SO leaders through matrix management
 - organizational adjustment and institutional strengthening
 - accountability for results, quality, efficient resource use



FAO's 5 New Strategic Objectives

1. Contribute to eradication of hunger, food insecurity and malnutrition
 2. Increase and improve provision of goods and services from agriculture, forestry and fisheries in a sustainable manner
 3. Reduce rural poverty
 4. Enable more inclusive and efficient agricultural and food systems at local, national and international levels
 5. Increase the resilience of livelihoods to threats and crises

FAO's results-based model

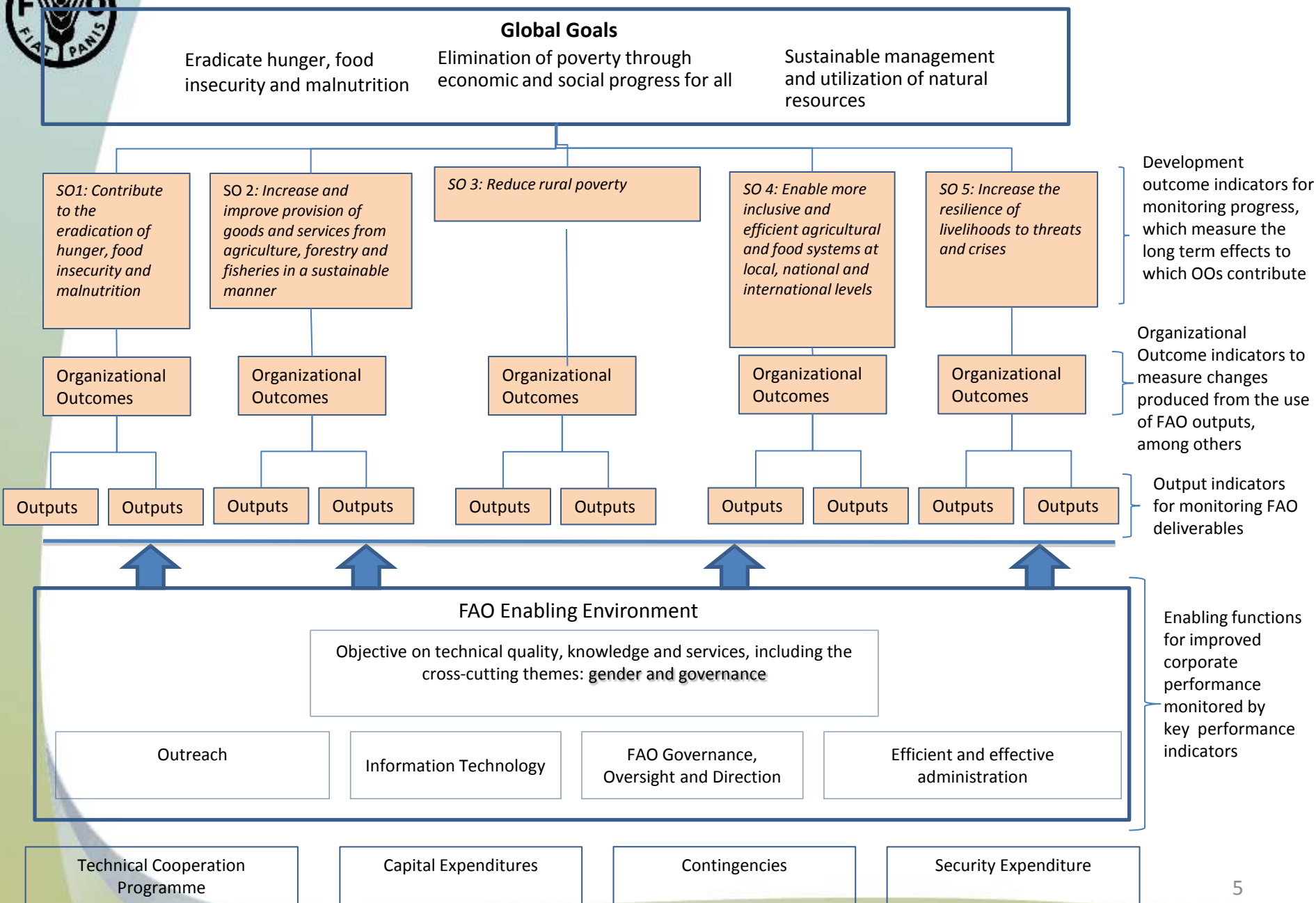

Strategic Objectives	Development Outcome	The long-term effects (10 years) Change to which the Organizational Outcomes contribute.	Development outcomes are achieved through the combined contributions of governments, FAO and other UN agencies and other partners and stakeholders.
Organizational Outcomes^[2]	Intermediate Outcome	The short-term effect (4 years) Change produced from the use of FAO outputs, among others.	Outcomes are achieved in direct partnership with governments and other partners and stakeholders, who are mutually responsible.
Outputs	Output	Set of deliverables that result from FAO's intervention (processes, tangible products and services).	FAO produces and is directly accountable for Outputs.
Activities	The processes that turn inputs into outputs	Set of FAO activities relevant to the achievement of the outputs.	FAO carries out and is directly accountable for Activities.

Regional Initiative Under SO 2: The Regional Rice Initiative

1. Focus on the importance of goods/services produced by and available from rice ecosystems
2. Identify sustainable rice production practices to enhance resilience and increase efficiencies in rice production to improve food security
3. 5 FAO offices (Indonesia, Laos, Philippines, HQs, RAP) actively involved
4. 15 technical officers involved from 7 different units at HQs and RAP
5. Partnerships developed with over 10 national and international entities
