

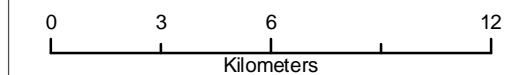
The project "Emergency supply of animal feed to conflict affected small-scale farming households and support to the Agriculture Sector and Food Security Cluster coordination in Georgia" funded by USAID aims to protect livelihoods of vulnerable livestock holders in conflict-affected area and provides technical assistance and coordination support to ensure that the affected population accrues greater benefits from all related rural households food security intervention.

With this intervention, FAO managed to help most vulnerable small-scale farming households in 127 conflict affected villages to distribute 4 240 MT of feed to 18 244 households in Shida Kartli region from February to March 2009.

In the autumn of 2009 an additional 300 MT of concentrated animal feed is being distributed targeted at over 2000 most vulnerable households in 24 villages in the area adjacent to South Ossetia still recovering from the aftermath of the conflict having no access to arable or pastureland.
