What is e-Agriculture?

An emerging field focusing on the enhancement of agricultural and rural development through improved information and communication processes. More specifically, e-Agriculture involves the conceptualization, design, development, evaluation and application of innovative ways to use information and communication technologies (ICT) in the rural domain, with a primary focus on agriculture.

Why e-Agriculture?

e-Agriculture is one of the action lines identified in the Declaration and Plan of Action of the World Summit on the Information Society (WSIS).



What is e-agriculture.org?

www.e-agriculture.org is the Internet platform of this global initiative aimed at promoting sustainable agricultural development and food security by improving the use of information, communication, and associated technologies in the sector.

What is the goal of the platform?

To enable Community members to exchange opinions, experiences, good practices and resources related to e-Agriculture, and to ensure that the knowledge created is effectively shared and used worldwide.



How is this accomplished?

Through being one element of a Community of Expertise, which includes a range of participants, such as policy makers, planners, development practitioners, farmer organizations, researchers and information and communication specialists involved in agriculture and rural development.

Community members interact with each other though regular forums and community networking, and contribute a range of resources to the platform, including case studies, success stories, lessons learned, documents, publications, links, learning resources, news and announcements.

- Organization of face-to-face events
- In-country interventions
