








EUROPEAN SOIL DATA BASE




A database on soils of Eurasia developed by the EC jointly with V.V. Dokuchaev Soil Institute of Russian Academy of Agricultural Science,



Vector (geometric) dataset:


- > 50.000 polygons







Food security in the Framework of G8



May 18-19, 2012, the leaders of Britain, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Russia, and the EU joined President Obama at Camp David for the annual G8 Summit. The leaders met to address major global economic, political, and security challenges, including energy and climate change, food security and nutrition, Afghanistan's economic transition and transitions taking place across the Middle East and North Africa. President Obama and G8 leaders announced a new alliance on food security with African leaders and the private sector as part of an effort to lift 50 million people out of poverty over the next decade.

GSP 5 Pillars of Action

- 3- Promote targeted soil research and development focusing on identified gaps and priorities and synergies with related productive, environmental and social development actions
- 4- Enhance the quantity and quality of soil data and information: data collection (generation), analysis, validation, reporting, monitoring and integration with other disciplines
- 5- Harmonization of methods, measurements and indicators for the sustainable management and protection of soil resources






Way forward
