DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the overall guidance of the FAO Representative in Cambodia and the operational guidance of the Operations Coordinator of the FAO Representation, under the technical supervision of the Lead Technical Officer at the Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific (RAP) and relevant technical divisions at FAO Headquarters, and in close consultation with the National Project Director (NPD) of the Ministry of Environment counterpart the CTA will:

- Organize the inception workshop, refine the work plan and provide a inception report;
- Establish of participatory methodology for baseline development and monitoring of project interventions and activities, including in project sites;
- Initiate and manage the selection and recruitment of consultants and National Project Personnel, and organize and supervise consultant inputs;
- Coordinate and monitor the implementation of the project, including in pilot sites;
- Coordinate the training on and updates of national databases to include climate change vulnerability assessments to facilitate sustained capacity building and informed decision making and policies;
- Lead the design of participatory integrated micro watershed development plans, and facilitate the implementation of a suite of physical measures proposed to achieve climate resilience;
- Facilitate the establishment of FFS, integration of climate change curriculum into FFS, introduction of climate resilient crops and appropriate farming systems for establishing climate smart farms;
- Support business plan development and implementation of suitable climate resilient livelihood options for women;
- Oversee capacity building and dissemination of information on the project activities, the training programmes, and networking;
- Manage and facilitate interaction among the actors in all project areas;
- Monitor progress and alert the budget holder, the Lead Technical Officer, the Project Task Force and the National Project Director to potential problems that could result in delays in implementation;
- Promote and facilitate knowledge management, knowledge sharing, identification and dissemination of lessons learned;
- Undertake quality control and assurance;
- Support communication, advocacy and policy dialogue.
- Perform other duties required for the satisfactory completion of the above.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Candidates should meet the following:

- Advanced university degree in Forestry or Rural Development or Watershed Management, or a related subject.
- Seven years of relevant project management experience and technical work in the sectors of rural development, food security or natural resources management in developing countries
- Working knowledge of English and limited knowledge of French, Spanish Russian, Chinese or Arabic

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Proven experience in implementing participatory development projects in developing or least developed countries, particularly in Cambodia;
- Extent of understanding of the socio-economic context, institutional set-up and food security and climate change challenges in Cambodia;
- Depth of knowledge of the Farmer Field School approach
- Extent of experience with managing complex projects in multiple locations in line with project cycle management principles
- Extent of experience in working with national institutions, FAO/UN agencies and development partners, including in

- capacity development and the building of synergies;
- Demonstrated leadership, managerial, supervisory and inter-personal skills
- Work experience in more than one location or area of work, particularly in field positions is desirable
