GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF TASK(S) AND OBJECTIVES TO BE ACHIEVED

The function is located in the Fisheries and Aquaculture Policy and Resources Division (FIA). FIA is responsible for the economic, social, institutional, governance and policy aspects of FAO's activities related to fisheries and aquaculture and their development, with particular emphasis on human well-being, food security and poverty reduction; post-harvest utilization, marketing and trade with due regard to the protection of the environment, food security and the well-being of fishing communities; collection, compilation, validation, trend analysis and dissemination of the best available and up-to-date fishery statistics and for the syndication of the FAO information on all aspects of world fisheries and aquaculture. The Division is also responsible for FAO's activities related to the management and conservation of the living aquatic resources used by fisheries and aquaculture, including the biodiversity and ecosystem maintenance, with particular emphasis on most vulnerable and threatened species and habitats; management of responsible fisheries and aquaculture in accordance with modern management standards and best practices; development of fisheries technology, with due regard to the protection of the environment, food security and the well-being of fishing communities, including the safety of fishers and fishing vessels.

The consultant will work in the Fisheries and Aquaculture Information and Statistics Branch (FIAS). FIAS is responsible for global statistics and information on fisheries and aquaculture, coordinates the development of international standards for fishery and aquaculture statistics, and supports partnership arrangements for the collation, sharing and dissemination of information. FIAS holds the Secretariat of the Fishery and Resources Monitoring System (FIRMS), a Partnership arrangement for sharing information on the status and trends of fishery resources.

Under the overall supervision of the Branch Chief FIAS, and in close collaboration with relevant staff of FAO, the consultant will support the FIRMS partners in fulfilling their reporting on the state of fishery resources. The function is primarily that of supporting and managing information flows for publishing in the FIRMS website.

More specifically, As a FIRMS Secretariat team member, the consultant will:

- Provide technical support/help desk to FIRMS Partners (internal and external RFBs partners) regarding their information contributions; this
 includes coordination for the development and validation of fishery resources inventories among the network of regional, and national focal
 points.
- Manage information regarding the reporting of FAO and associated Members (FAO RFBs), and/or provide technical assistance, or training as required.
- Support with technical contributions the Regional/training workshops including meeting documents, presentations and training delivery, and assist FIRMS Secretary on networking aspects.

- Lead or contribute to FIRMS Steering Committee recommendations, including working interactions with internal and external partners.
- Prepare technical topics for FIRMS Technical Working Group [e]-Meetings, facilitate discussions on such topics during the TWG [e]-Meetings, and report writing.
- Contribute to the development of improvements of the FIRMS website including web pages editing.
- Contribute to the specifications of the Global Record of Stocks and Fisheries (GRSF BlueBRIDGE project), by liaising with holders of stocks and fisheries information sources that will contribute to the Global record (data managers of Ram Stocks assessment Legacy database, FIRMS partners, FishSource, FishBase, etc...; and by analysing data structure and contribute to the specifications for unique identifiers.
- Handle the Word/Excel-to-XML workflow for fact sheets production and upload in the FIRMS website as necessary.
- Any other matters as required.
