DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the overall guidance of the Legal Counsel or the Chief, LEGA, as may be appropriate, and under overall supervision of the Chief, LEGN, the incumbent will:

- advise Member Governments on the legal and institutional aspects of the management and development of agriculture and natural resources;
- conduct and supervise the planning operation of field projects and the selection/supervision of consultants;
- conduct advisory missions involving the most complex, sensitive and novel legal issues in the area of agriculture and natural resources management and development;
- provide FAO technical divisions with advice, information and assistance on the legal and institutional aspects of the management and development of agriculture and natural resources;
- review legal frameworks and prepare recommended texts of laws, regulations and other legal instruments;
- carry out legal research;
- analyse, select and summarize legal texts for recording and publication;
- respond to requests for information on national and international law, relating to agriculture and the management and development of natural resources;
- participate as required in working groups, meetings, seminars and conferences;
- provide guidance to colleagues on the most complex legal issues, as required;
- perform other duties as required.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

Candidates should meet the following:

- University degree in law
- Seven years of relevant experience in legal work in the field of natural resources or development law
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two or Arabic, Chinese or Russian

SELECTION CRITERIA

Candidates will be assessed against the following:

- Extent of relevant knowledge and professional experience in natural resources legislation or development law (including forestry and land law), in particular in drafting legislative and regulatory instruments and/or legal documents
- Extent of experience in developing countries in legal and institutional matters, including in different legal systems
- Extent of knowledge of and relevance of experience in the administration of field projects
- Extent of communication skills both oral and written with proficiency in drafting and preparing legal work papers and reports in English
- Fluency also in French would be a strong asset
- Ability to conduct legal research, analyses and studies in the field of in natural resources legislation or development law (including forestry and land law) and international environment law
