Organizational Setting

FAO's Subregional Office for North Africa (SNE) is responsible for developing, promoting, overseeing and implementing agreed strategies for addressing subregional food, agriculture and rural development priorities. It develops and maintains relations with subregion-wide institutions including Regional Economic Integration Organizations (REIOs). It assists the FAO Representations (FAORs) in the subregion with addressing subregional food security, agriculture and rural development issues at country level. The Subregional Office is a subsidiary of FAO's Regional Office for the Near East and North Africa.

The post is located in the Subregional Office for North Africa, Tunis, Tunisia.

Reporting Lines

The Senior Policy Officer reports to the Assistant Director General, Regional Representative and maintains regular contact with FAO headquarters in Rome for functional guidance on matters relating to policy and governance support in the food and agricultural sectors.

Technical Focus

Provides leadership, guidance and operational support for results-based policy assistance and governance work of decentralized offices in the Sub Region, in relation to regional and sub-regional policy issues, and provides guidance to the work of policy officers posted at country level in relation to their work on food security, nutrition and sustainable agricultural development.

Key Results

Development and implementation of coherent, integrated and effective policy assistance and governance work supporting member states at regional and country level: i) in accordance with the FAO Strategic Framework and its delivery mechanisms, and ii) in response to new policy assistance requests.

Key Functions

- Manages or leads highly specialized or multi-disciplinary teams, and provides technical leadership in high-level policy analysis missions or projects, policy networks and/or international policy setting bodies
- Leads the work carried out by technical or policy officers from HQ or out-posted staff in the Decentralized Offices in relation to policy and governance work under FAO's strategic framework
- Advocates strategic partnerships, best practices, and policy dialogue in support of enhanced policies and governance for food and nutrition security, sustainable agriculture and food systems
- Interacts with UN Regional and Country teams to improve cross-sectoral policies and strategies concerning agriculture, food, and nutrition security and sustainable development
- Analyzes regional and country-level issues to provide input into the identification of country and regional priorities and requirements
- Designs, implements and monitors regional and sub-regional policy work programmes and the supporting budgets and/or resourcing strategies
- Plans, organizes and participates in capacity development activities involving the provision of technical advice and assistance, and oversees the development of related materials, on-line tools and information kits.
- Represents the Organization at international/inter-governmental meetings and conferences

Specific Functions

- Leads regular reviews of the food and agricultural sectors, including stakeholder analysis
- Supports the improvement of the rationale, policy scope and relevance of Country Programming Frameworks towards achieving FAO's global goals
- Promotes the uptake at country level of key corporate policy programmes and messages
- Develops and negotiates effective working relationships and agreements with international and national partners, contributing to an enhanced governance of food and nutrition security, sustainable agriculture and food systems
- Promotes the implementation and monitoring at regional and country level of the Post-2015 Sustainable Development Goals and of the Zero Hunger Challenge in interaction with relevant partners
- Supports the monitoring of policies at regional and country level, and initiatives and tools contributing to the monitoring of

- actions and investments
- Promotes the coherence of FAO's policy and investment support work at country level
- Contributes to the preparation of and follow-up to the Regional Conference.
