Organizational Setting

Through its Country Offices, or FAO Representations, FAO assists governments to develop policies, programmes and projects to address hunger and malnutrition, and provides technical support for the sustainable development of their agricultural, fisheries and forestry sectors. The activities of the FAO Country Offices include design and implementation of country-tailored field programmes, liaison with local donor representatives, and active public awareness-raising and outreach activities related to FAO initiatives such as the World Food Day.

The Sub-regional Resilience Team for Eastern Africa based in Nairobi in close coordination with Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD) is supporting the IGAD Drought Disaster Resilience and Sustainability Initiative (IDDRSI) development and implementation while providing as well strategic, programmatic and technical guidance to FAO and member country programmes on the resilience agenda. The RTEA work streams in the region are centered around four blocks in addressing resilience:

1. Support to review and formulation of regional policy and regulatory frameworks
2. Support to addressing cross border and regional priorities resilience
3. Enhancing resilience programming and emergency response in the region
4. Support to evidence based decision making through regional resilience, food security and nutrition information and analysis

Reporting Lines

The Livestock Officer works under the overall guidance of FAO Representative in Kenya (Officer in Charge of the Regional Resilience Team for Eastern Africa ' RTEA) and Delivery Manager of Regional Initiative on Building Resilience in Africa's Drylands (RI3). He/she works under the supervision of the Resilience Coordinator of the Resilience Team for Eastern Africa (RTEA), Nairobi, Kenya and in close collaboration with the multi-disciplinary team of the Sub-Regional Office for Eastern Africa (SFE) based in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

Technical Focus

Support implementation of FAO RTEA four (4) strategic focus areas on building resilience in Eastern Africa with specific technical leadership in the area of livestock and pastoralism programming, emergency needs assessment and response contributing directly to outputs of Regional Initiative on Building resilience in Africa's Drylands (RI3) and the broader FAO Strategic Objective 5 Outputs.

Key Results

Comprehensive technical and programmatic expertise provided to support the planning, development and implementation of FAO Sub-regional Resilience Team for Eastern Africa programmes, projects, products and services in accordance with Technical Cooperation objectives, Regional Initiatives objectives and FAO Strategic Objective Five (SO5).

Key Functions

- Provides technical and programmatic leadership in the area of livestock and pastoralism, natural resources management, promote inter-regional cooperation/advocate best practices and policy dialogue at intergovernmental levels;
- Provides policy advice and mobilize technical assistance to countries in the areas of cross border actions, resilience programming (facilitate knowledge exchange across countries) and information and analysis on food security, nutrition and resilience;

- Collaborates in, provides technical expertise in RTEA's thematic areas of transboundary animal and plant health, natural resources management and regional trade and market integration;
- Leads the emergency needs assessment and provides technical support to emerging and ongoing operational emergency and recovery projects and programmes, Level-3 response systems and surge mechanisms in Eastern Africa in close liaison with FAO Strategic Objective 5 teams at all levels.
- Contributes to RTEA proposal development and resources mobilization activities in accordance with the FAO corporate strategy.
- Leads the IGAD-FAO partnership programme on drought resilience technical teams and provide specialized expertise in implementation while ensuring coordination and synergies between FAO and IGAD respective components;
- Leads the development of technical, analytical, monitoring and reporting framework of the project in collaboration with IGAD and its specialized institution to support the planning and implementation;
- Responds to country project request on technical and policy assistance, provides technical advice, assistance and solutions to Decentralized Offices including backstopping of other FAO RTEA projects;
- Leads and maintain regional livestock and pastoralism coordination with IGAD Centre for Pastoral Areas and Livestock Development (ICPALD), and represent FAORTEA in other technical network when required
- Supports Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD) and member countries in the design and implementation of regional and national resilience strategies and programme that promotes livestock and pastoralism development in the region.
