Tasks and responsibilities

Purpose of the assignment

Under the overall supervision of the FAO Sub-regional Coordinator for Central Asia and FAO Representative in Turkey, the direct technical guidance and supervision of the LTO and project Chief Technical Advisor (CTA), and in close liaison with EBA International consultant, the local steppe expert will perform the following tasks:

- Literature review in relation to the status of Anatolian steppe in the KCB in general and Pilot districts in particular, including policies, strategies and government plans.
- Analysis of the conditions of steppe in the field by using contemporary scientific techniques,
- Assess the status and trends of steppe, its tenurial arrangements and the effects of tenure on the health of steppe in the region. Also reflect on how much the steppe is subject to the tragedy of commons and reflect on its future.
- Assess the overall demographic influence in general and the management practices of steppe in the pilot districts. Also reflect on the nexus of other land uses such as agriculture, forestry with the steppe.
- Contribute to the steppe mapping process by the GIS team
- Identify and document the best practices related to steppe management by the local people as well as by the Governmental and non-governmental institutions.
- Develop a concise report on the above mentioned assessment
- The extent of pollution, including from excess nutrients, are/not detrimental to ecosystem function and biodiversity.
- Support other international consultants working on the EBA strategy and tailor the above information to be integrated in the EBA strategy.
- After each mission prepare a brief technical report summarizing his findings, conclusions and recommendations.
- Carry out any other activities relevant to this assignment, including ensuring and monitoring women's participation.
