Tasks and responsibilities:

Under the supervision of the regional UN-REDD focal point in FAO RAP, with technical guidance from the remote sensing thematic team leader of the REDD+ team at FAO HQ, the guidance of the senior forestry officer in RAP, and in coordination with the wider REDD+ Programme team in FAO HQ and in the Asia Pacific region, the consultant will:

- Supervise and provide technical guidance for the design and development of national satellite land and forest monitoring systems and associated web-GIS portals in UN-REDD partner countries in the Asia-Pacific region;
- Build capacities of government counterparts and other relevant stakeholders on the use of remote sensing and GIS for forest monitoring, and forest cover change assessment, with a focus on compliance with UNFCCC and IPCC guidance on REDD+
- Use diverse sources of spatial information and tools to support the development of monitoring systems customized to national circumstances (e.g. local data sources, forest management needs, existing monitoring efforts);
- Support the development of web-based visualization and dissemination tools for geospatial data with particular emphasis on REDD+ MRV and REDD+ monitoring, in collaboration with the national and regional stakeholders and the UN-REDD team (FAO HQ, Rome);
- Support the preparation of developer and user documentation in English and deliver training and technical assistance;
- Undertake backstopping missions to support the implementation and operationalization of the monitoring systems and deliver associated training and backstopping, in particular Sri Lanka, Cambodia, Myanmar, Vietnam, Mongolia, Indonesia, Papua New Guinea and Bangladesh;
- Prepare periodic and final progress reports;
- Perform other technical and operational duties, as necessary.
