## **Organizational Setting**

The International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC) is an international agreement on plant health to which more than 180 contracting parties currently adhere. It aims to protect cultivated and wild plants by preventing the introduction and spread of plant pests. Achieving this aim has significant global benefits for enhanced food security, trade facilitation and environment protection. The IPPC Secretariat is provided by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations. As laid out in the IPPC text, contracting parties agree to cooperate in the development of international standards, which are adopted by the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM). For plant health, the international standards, guidelines and recommendations developed under the auspices of the IPPC Secretariat are recognized by the WTO-SPS agreement. The post is the Team Leader of the Standard Setting Unit, which provides support to ensuring the IPPC standard setting procedure is followed.

## **Reporting Lines**

The Senior Agricultural Officer reports to the Secretary to the International Plant Protection Convention.

## **Technical Focus**

The team leader will have a solid overview of phytosanitary systems and will set Policy and Strategic direction for standard setting at the global level to help ensure phytosanitary measures are harmonized, which entails collaborating with Strategic Programmes and other technical divisions. The team lead will also provide leadership in the development of international standards, guidelines and recommendations to help harmonize phytosanitary measures put in place by contracting parties in line with both IPPC and FAO strategic objectives.

## **Key Results**

Leadership and technical policy expertise for the planning, development and implementation of Departmental / Division Programmes of work, projects, products, services in accordance with FAO's Strategic Objectives.

## **Key Functions**

- Plans, manages, or leads highly specialized or multi-disciplinary teams, leads, coordinates, and/or participates on Organization-wide, cross-Departmental committees, project teams, and working groups, and/or provides technical leadership/secretariat services on technical networks and/or international technical policy and standard setting bodies.
- Analyzes global and country specific requirements and relevant technical issues to provide critical input into the FAO Strategic Objectives, Programme of Work, work plans and the supporting budgets and/or resourcing strategies
- Implements and monitors programmes of work involving the development of the approach, evidence based strategies, and related tools, methodologies and the supporting system/database, monitoring and reporting frameworks.
- Conducts, designs and oversees research and analysis activities to support the development of technical standards, international instruments, innovation, technical reports, publications and/or on-going programme development as well as the provision of technical and/or policy advisory services.
- Provides technical and policy advisory services to Member Countries and technical support to Decentralized Offices in the development and implementation of their programmes of work.
- Leads and/or collaborates in, provides technical backstopping to and ensures the quality / effectiveness of capacity development and knowledge sharing activities within member countries such as policy support, organizational development and individual learning events including preparation of related information, learning

- materials, on-line tools.
- Represents the Organization at international/inter-governmental meetings and conferences, advocates strategic
  partnerships, best practices and increased policy dialogue and develops and negotiates effective working
  relationships/consensus and agreements with international and national partners.
- Leads or participates in resource mobilization activities in accordance with the FAO Corporate strategy.

### **Specific Functions**

- Represents IPPC and FAO in international fora related to phytosanitary and plant health areas.
- Oversees and facilitates the setting of International Standards for Phytosanitary Measures (ISPMs) in line with guidance and priorities set by the CPM and following the IPPC Standard Setting Procedure in support of countries for the effective implementation of FAO's normative work addressing phytosanitary issues.
- Manages the Standards Committee and sub groups, including facilitating the development of standards through the IPPC Standard Setting Procedure and related interpretation, translation and publishing.
- Contributes to the overall governance of the IPPC including facilitating governing bodies and developing strategic direction related to standard setting.
- Leads and contributes to and/or provides technical support in the implementation of FAO's and IPPC's strategic framework.

## **Minimum Requirements**

- Advanced University degree in Agronomy, Plant Science with specialization in plant health, crop improvement, crop science or related field.
- Ten years of relevant experience working internationally on phytosanitary matters at a senior level with public or private sector institutions, international organizations with an emphasis on plant health
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two or Arabic, Chinese, Russian
