Organizational Setting

The FISHCODE Project Cycle Management Unit serves as the principal instrument for project cycle management in the Fisheries and Aquaculture Department of FAO. It promotes and supports the implementation of the Code of Conduct for Responsible Fisheries and streamline the Organization's Blue Growth Initiative (BGI) in actions aimed at food security, poverty alleviation and sustainable management of living aquatic resources into national fisheries policy.

Reporting Lines

The Programme Officer reports to the FISHCODE Manager.

Technical Focus

Project cycle management, cash-based transfer projects, operational modality and procedures, risk management, capacity development, resource mobilization and human resource management.

Key Results

Comprehensive administrative and operational support to field programme development and management that is funded primarily by extra-budgetary resources for fisheries and aquaculture projects and programmes.

Key Functions

- Supports the development/ formulation, funding, and implementation of projects (in particular, those having a Global and Inter-Regional scope and coverage) ensuring they are operationally viable and meet the Organization's policy standards and best practices and requirements of participants, with adequate inputs from FI and other technical departments, and in appropriate consultation with the donor community and the Technical Cooperation Department (TC) and strategic programme teams (DDP);
- Provides effective support to the implementation of Fisheries and Aquaculture projects at all stages, including coordination of logistical and administrative arrangements, monitoring of project resources/implementation progress and addressing outstanding operational problems; advise and/or brief technical officers on operational aspects;
- Supports the organization and appropriate functioning of relevant Project Task Force and Project Steering Committee meetings, including for the development and updating of work plans during implementation phases;
- Monitors delivery and budget allocations and support the drafting of annual project work plans, related budgets and budget revisions/adjustments, as well as periodic progress and terminal reports for review by those units having technical, financial and operational responsibility, for in submission to TC and donors, as appropriate;
- Ensures timely authorizations for processing and distribution of progress reports and other documents as required, as prepared and cleared by the LTUs, for submission to donors and other parties.

Specific Functions

- Supports the Department with advanced experience of FAO /UN Project Cycle Management and project financial management to support the development of FAO's technical assistance in the area of fisheries and aquaculture, at national, regional and global levels, and allow better response to resource mobilization opportunities;
- Contributes developed technical systems (MIS) use and knowledge to allow timely reporting to donors and control of project issues such as over/under expenditures, correct accounting of expenditures and respect of

- scheduled tasks;
- Assists the FISHCODE Manager in applying an increased strategic focus of Departmental activities, in line with the Organization's strategic framework and its Blue Growth Initiative, and based on the principles of the Code of Conduct for Responsible Fisheries.

- Advanced university degree in accounting, finance, business administration or a related field of the Organization;
- Three years of relevant experience in finance, accounting and/or business analysis, with focus on large international projects;
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and a limited knowledge of one of the other two or Arabic, Chinese, Russian.
